COQUALEETZA RESIDENTIAL SCHOOL.

EXPLANATORY.

At the commencement of the influenza epidemic from which the schools of British Columbia have suffered in common with the Province generally, we had a number of cases of pneumonia. In order to keep down the expenditure of sending them to the hospital, we increased accommodation in the infirmary by taking a radiator from the store-room, where it was not needed, and installed it in the sun porch of the infirmary, where there had been previously no heat, thus increasing our accommodation by making use of the sun porch.

By this expediency we were able to look after the less serious cases of pneumonia. This emergency measure was considered desirable by the Department's Doctor, not only to increase our accommodation during the epidemic, but as economy as he would only take to the hospital severe cases where there was danger and when he considered it absolutely necessary.

While this expenditure was not authorized by the Department, and I understand it is their policy not to pay, for obvious reasons, any vouchers and receipts not previously approved: I trust the Department will consider this bill favourably in the light of emergent conditions, which made the work a necessity.

EXPLANATION

We had a few cases of chicken pox last Fall which we isolated in a cottage we use when necessary, as an isolation hospital. In this cottage we did not have the conveniences necessary for the Nurse and we felt it imperative there should be a toilet built adjoining the house and septic tank installed at a proper distance.

In order to affect this improvement as economically as possible with efficiency, we purchased some of the material at a second hand junk store in Vancouver, and lumber for the lean-to and septic tank in Chilliwack. I obtained the assistance of one skilled plumber who, together with the Manual Training Instructor and boys, made the septic tank and did all the wood work. The total cost of the material and installing the toilet and septic tank and connecting waste pipe was \$64.43. The job complete, if by contract and new material throughout, would have cost \$100.00.

It is complete and modern. We have been using this building without this convenience for a couple of years and we just completed it when we had one case of Scarletina which was immediately isolated and the Nurse in charge of the case during the colder months had the benefit of this improvement, which, I am sure the Department will consider a very necessary and legitimate expenditure.

EXPLANATORY

At the commencement of the influenza epidemic from which the schools of British Columbia have suffered in common with the Province generally, we had a number of cases of pneumonia. In order to keep down the expenditure of sending them to the hospital, we increased accommodation in the infirmary by taking a radiator from the store-room, where it was not needed, and installed it in the sun porch of the infirmary, where there had been previously no heat, thus increasing our accommodation by making use of the sun porch.

By this expediency we were able to look after the less serious cases of pneumonia. This emergency measure was considered desirable by the Department's Doctor, not only to increase our accommodation during the epidemic, but as economy, as he would only take to the hospital severe cases where there was danger and when he considered it absolutely necessary.

While this expenditure was not authorized by the Department, and I understand it is their policy not to pay, for obvious reasons, any vouchers and receipts not previously approved; I trust the Department will consider this bill favourably in the light of emergent conditions, which made the work a necessity.

Dear Mr. Daunt:

In reference to your letter dated November 20, 1933, file # 1-8-B, enclosing copy of letter dated Ottawa, November 6, 1933, #153-0-5, the following repairs were carried out as suggested by the Inspector of Boilers:

✓ Boiler # 12358. The blow down pipe and cold water supply pipe to the boiler, and new fusible plug, etc, renewed, installed and repairs made.

✓ With reference to Boiler #12369, the new fusible plug has been installed.

✓ Regarding Boiler #43804, the Boiler has been re-tubed throughout as recommended.

* With reference to the Inspector's report on the difficulty in the circulation of the whole plant, I had a heating expert go over the matter and am enclosing a copy of his recommendation for changes in the system. He recommends that all traps on radiators be sent to the factory and the installation of a 2" P.R. valve with controller and a 4" P.R. valve with controller, and the installation of an 8000' vacuum pump. He also states that the cost could be cut down by using the Vacuum Sub Atmospheric System.

With reference to the domestic water supply, it is suggested the installing of a 200 gallon tank, in addition to what we have would be sufficient for the needs of the school. This would be linked up to the High Pressure boiler and


