Dear Sir:- Re-New Indian School at Kamloops.

When visiting the Kamloops School on the 12th instant, Rev. John Duplanil, the Principal, drew my attention to the fact that on page 69 of the Specifications it provides that there are to be trough-urinals. The Rev. Principal would prefer that these urinals should be up-right ones the same as those in the new Lytton School.

It is also observed that there are to be no toilets in the washrooms on the ground floor. The Principal considers there should be at least one in each washroom and I believe he is correct in this regard. Therefore, I would recommend that the changes above mentioned should be made.

I observe also that the front doors of the present building are being seriously affected by the strong sun and I would recommend the Principal be authorized to purchase sufficient oil and varnish to keep these doors in good condition. The labor of putting on the varnish will be done without cost.





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
