

Re: Decorating Indian Residential School.

I have your letter of October 16th, returning voucher in favor of Mr. Ayriss for decorating done by him to the sitting rooms and chapel at the school and also to the farmer's residence, for the reason that you had no record of any authority having been given by the Department for the expenditure.

There was no authority given directly by the Department, but when Mr. Inspector Gooderham was shewn the condition in which the farmer's residence, with the plaster all falling down, the roof leaking and paper &c hanging off the walls, he gave instructions to have what work was necessary, done.

This was not the case in connection with the decorating of the sitting rooms and no authority was given to have this work done, but the circumstances were as follows:-

After all the other work around the building had been done, halls redecorated, staff dining room redecorated, outer & inner office redecorated, there remained the two sitting rooms, just inside the front door to which all visitors and guests were taken when they came to the school. The paper on both the walls and ceilings of these rooms was in very bad shape and in many places was hanging loose. This was caused by the leaky roof which had been repaired by the year before.

It was an unsightly mess and Mr. Ayriss having offered to do the two rooms for \$50.00 we told him to go ahead and do the job, hoping that the money might be forthcoming from somewhere to pay for it.


When you were at the school some little time ago in connection with the estimates for 1948 - 49, the condition of the heaters in the pump house and milk room was drawn to your attention, with a view to authority being obtained for the purchase of two new stoves.

You will possibly also remember that one of these heaters collapsed last spring with the result that a fire was started in the floor between the pump house and the milk room above and had it not been that the engineer at the school happened to go down there the building might very easily have gone up in smoke.

You at that time authorized us to buy a new stove, but they were hard to get and having wired up the old stove as well as we could, we were able to get through for the season, but it will be impossible for us to go through the winter with the two wrecks we have.

Would it be too much to ask, that you take the matter up with the Department with a view to the necessary authority being obtained for the purchase of the two new stoves so urgently required. Winter may be clamping down on us at any time and it would be well to be prepared against frost damage to our water system.

returning voucher No. 402-47, in favor of Saskatoon Welding
Co., for \$1223.94.

Detailed account from the Saskatoon Welding Co.,
and is now attached to voucher which is returned herewith.
In regard to quotations from other firms, would say that
these boilers were in such condition that the Inspector
intended to condemn them until it was pointed out to him
by one of his assistants that this action would mean
closing the school as no new boilers of this kind are
available at present. We could not find any other firm
who would even consider looking over the job and it was
only after a great deal of talking that we were able to
persuade the Saskatoon Welding Co. to undertake the work.
When the boilers were torn down they were found to be in
even worse condition than was at first thought.

In regard to supervision of the work, I was at the
school ~~once~~ while they were working at the job and once when
they ^{were} finishing. The boiler inspectors were there four times
to inspect the work being done and either Mr. Staley or
Mr. Faunt were in the building all the time the work was
being done and inspected it on numerous occasions.
