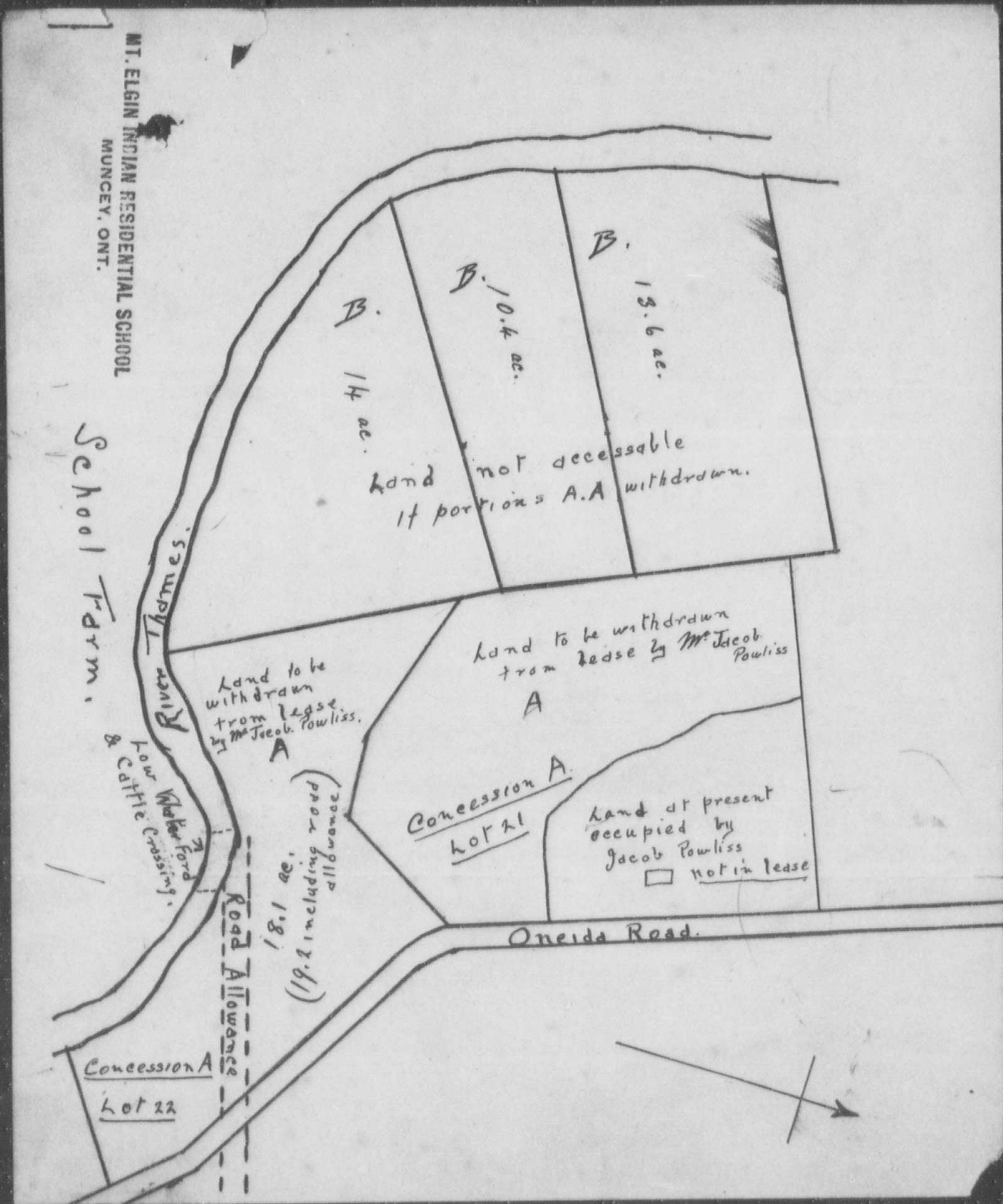

I am having some slight disturbance with the Rev. O. B. Strapp in reference to leases between Oneida Indians and the management of the Mt. Elgin Institute.

He is of the opinion that it is my duty to make all arrangements. I differ. Pointing out that the contract is first a contract between Locatee and Lessee, it then becomes the business of this Office for submission to the Department for consideration.

" Right " or " Wrong " ?

I submitted copies of enclosed sample form, which is a duplication of your last year's form, to Mr. Strapp, asking him to please have the necessary signatures appended and return to this Office, when it would be submitted to the Department for consideration. He promptly returned them with the explanation that it had always been done at this Office. I again returned them to him, pointing out that if he intended renewing the contracts, the form was the requirement of the Department of Indian Affairs and not this Office, and that the signatures were necessary for the locatees' consent. To date, I have heard nothing from him direct. The writer's object in writing is to point out that I do not intend to take the abuse that I took last year from Indian locatees, in connection with these



leases. Nor do I intend travelling around for signatures when that duty rightly belongs to the locatee or lessee. And as far as I am concerned, the leases will not be in operation until Mr. Strapp is ready to co-operate.

Co-operation is a personal ruling I have in my Office and I think, with your support I have the right to enforce it. If I am to administer this Office, no person other than the Department of Indian Affairs is going to dictate the procedure.

Application for renewal of these leases may by-pass this Office with a formal application, or they may arrive in proper form. In any case, I would request that they be returned to Mr. Strapp for presentation through the proper channels.

Dear Mr. Hoey;

In 1940 when the matter of the renewal of the Oneida Indian land leases was up for consideration I suggested that the term be for the period of ten years with the rental being paid annually, and pointed out that there was a strong possibility that in a few years we would have our whole program upset by the refusal of one Indian to renew his lease on the yearly basis. However in spite of my protest the leases were drawn on a yearly basis.

This year when the application for renewal of leases was being circulated by the owners of the various parcels Mr. Jacob Powliss refused to apply for renewal.

The situation now is that the portions B.B.B. on the rough sketch will not be of any use to for pasturage purposes because the only access is by way of the ford across the Thames River which is located within the parcel of land withdrawn from lease. This also means that the individual owners have no access to their land. I have marked the parcels that Mr. Powlis is not willing to re-lease A.A.

I understand that Mr. Powlis intends to lease these parcels to his son, who is at present living in the U.S.A., to be worked up and cropped this year.

Dear Mr. Hoey;

With reference to the Oneida Land Leases, Last year upon receipt of your letter informing me that it was your intention to continue these leases for the use of the school, I broke up about 80 acres of the high land and worked it as summer fallow. Mr. Agent Downs informed me that unless I obtain signatures to applications for renewal of these leases he will not forward an application to Ottawa for the renewals. I have obtained as many signatures as possible, and, yesterday I returned the list to his office, giving his secretary the information that I did not know who, or where, the people were that held the balance of the land and that I felt that the best thing to do would be to leave the list in his office so that those who had not signed could do so if, and when, they called to inquire about the leases.

I am in receipt of a letter from Mr. Downs in which he says "I must now tell you very plainly. Until the application form is complete, or the names without signatures erased, this office definitely refuses to accept it."

I am at a loss to understand the change in policy. Previously the whole matter has been handled by the Indian Agent as agent for the people and for the Indian Affairs Branch and the matter has been handled to the general satisfaction of all concerned. The Indian Agency is located in the village of Muncey and centrally located for all the parties concerned, it therefore seems to me to be the logical office to handle the matter.

I shall be pleased if you could give me permission to proceed with the work planned for this land, as it does not include the portion referred to in my letter of March 27th. owned by Mr. Jacob Powliss, who refuses to continue to lease his portion for the use of the school.

I wish to refer to lands of the Oneida Reserve now under consideration for lease, to the management of the Mt. Elgin Institute.

In this connection it becomes apparent that one man at least, does not wish to renew his contract. I understand this decision has been made because he wishes to establish his son and crop the land. Before operations can commence it will be necessary to fence this particular acreage. For the same reason it is also necessary that we know where the lines are. It is said, and I know it to be correct, that there is a plan of the said lands drawn by Kennedy in 1899. For reference, and establishing boundary lines of the individual holdings it would be appreciated, providing such a plan is in existence in Ottawa, if you would forward one to this Office.

If Mr. Jacob Powlis does not wish to lease the 18 acre parcel indicated on the Principal's sketch the writer does not see how he can be compelled.

Please examine the sketch. If it is accurate, the ford across the river, or rather the river bank to the ford, is on a road allowance there would appear to be no reason why the ford and the road allowance could not be used to get the cattle across to the available land, which comprises the balance of the sketch without trespass on the land which Powlis refuses to lease.

On the other hand, Powlis might be willing for a consideration to permit a lane being fenced from the ford to the nearest point on Lot 21 marked AA making access for the cattle to the balance of the land under lease.

It appears to the writer to be a matter for local adjustment which the Principal with a little ingenuity could solve for himself without shouting for help.
