

Reverend Sir:

It would appear that you will require a dental clinic of about three days, or two at the least. This will authorize expenditure for this purpose of not more than \$90.00. It is believed that you will get the best value for the money by organizing a clinic at the school, and it is strongly recommended that you do so, if at all possible.

If necessary, you may say that the Department is providing this money from public funds, has only the pupils' interest in mind, and has found the cost higher and the amount of work less, when the children are taken to the dentist.

There is, presumably, no reason for haste, and it should be possible for Doctor McLeod to so arrange his time as to be able to do this work at the school.

These observations are based on a review of the work done last year at Doctor McLeod's office, and on wide experience elsewhere.


