


The installation of the domestic hot water





Dear Mr. Phelan:-

As this month marks the end of the fiscal year I was hoping that the Tank Heater for domestic hot water for the Classroom Block and the main building to be installed by Carr & Son of Kamloops at a cost of \$988.00 could be approved before March 31st. Our hot water system, which has always been inadequate, has now been removed to allow for the installation of heating by Giddens & Sons for the Classroom Block and we are practically without hot water. The situation needs remedying immediately and the Tank referred to above is of the size required.

There has been some correspondence through the Offices of the Superintendent and the Commissioner with regard to the Electric Food Mixer and six Sewing Machines. It would be appreciated if these also could be supplied before the end of the current fiscal year.

The Stoker of the kitchen range for the Staff has worn out and has to be replaced. The Stoker quoted on By Giddens & Sons of Kamloops is of the correct size as there is only a space of six feet available between the middle of the fire box and the door opening into the kitchen.

The above mentioned pieces of equipment are all urgently required and could, if approved, be installed before the end of this month.
