Dear Sir:- Re: Wilhelmina Hill, Age 5 ?, Mohawk Institute.

History of family or other exposure to tuberculosis: no information. History of previous illness: negative. Present illness: It was noted that this child was somewhat quieter and more easily tired out than the average.

Physical examination: The eyes were bright with dark circles underneath. The child has an appearance of sub-normal health. Having waited a short time before the examination, the left side of the face became flushed. Glands are palpable along both sides of the neck. The excursion of the right side of the chest is slightly more easily controlled by bi-manual pressure than is the left. In the lower half of the right side the percussion note was noticeably impaired at the time of the first examination on October 22nd. On October 29th there was a suggestion of increased dullness in this region. An important finding was the prolonged expiratory phase to respiration in the right lung and in the left axillary region. The fact that this change in respiratory sound was in the lower half of the chest caused me to hesitate in the diagnosis even with a temperature of 100.2 at 10 A.M.

I considered the child too ill to employ an I.C. test and suggested that she return for re-examination on October 29th. When she returned on October 29th, Mr. Snell reported that the child had had complete rest for the past week. Her temperature was 99.4. The face was flushed and she had a listless tired out expression. The previously noted physical findings continued and in addition a very few, fine moist sounds were heard at the level of the nipple line in both axillary regions. Accompanying these were wheezing sounds throughout both lungs. These wheezing sounds were only occasionally present. The prolonged expiratory phase of the respiration undoubtedly indicates a congested inflamed condition of lung tissues. The fact that this has not subsided with a week's rest and the various other findings in this case amply justify a suspicion of tuberculosis as the causative factor in the child's subnormal condition of health.

An I.C. test was given and reported to be positive+++.

The expense of taking x-ray plates was not consider-

ed justifiable as sufficient evidence had been obtained to substantiate a diagnosis of tuberculosis.

This little girl's best prospects for recovery would be in a Preventorium. Certainly she is not a fit subject to continue in residence at the Mohawk Institute.

NOTE: The tonsil and adenoid condition warrants a continuance of observation.

You will note that he states that she is not a fit subject to continue in residence in the Institute, and that she should be placed in a Preventorium. Pursuant to suggestion from Mr. Phelan, I have interviewed the authorities of the Brant Sanatorium and they will admit her to their preventorium provided, of course, her admission is authorized by the Department with the assurance that the usual fee of \$1.00 per diem charged to municipalities will be paid. I am, therefore asking for authority to place her in the Brant Sanatorium as this seems to be the only chance of her recovering her health. Dr. Davis assured me that she would have no chance of recovery in her own home as her mother is dead and conditions are bad.

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

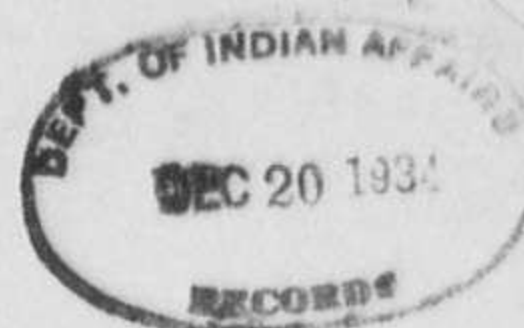

Reverend Sir:

I have your letter of the 17th instant, relative to the dental services required by the pupils of the Mohawk Institute.

In this connection I have to say that the Department is prepared to allow Dr. F. W. Landymore \$30.00 a day for not more than three days' work. A day's work is estimated at 7 hours - during which the dentist is expected to apply himself diligently. He must supply his own materials but is not required to provide gold fillings or any artificial teeth at this rate. Presumably, composition fillings would be satisfactory and no artificial teeth should be supplied. The dentist must use anaesthetics sufficiently to avoid unnecessary pain. You should assist by organizing the clinic and seeing that the dentist is kept supplied with patients.

The dentist should prepare his account, in triplicate, at the rate allowed, covering the period he is engaged, which should not exceed the time mentioned above. He should also prepare a list, giving the names of the pupils receiving attention and the work performed for each. Please certify the account and forward it to the Department for payment, with list attached of the work performed.

You should arrange with Dr. Landymore to carry out the dental services for the pupils at an early date.


Ottawa, January 28th, 1935.
