I am in receipt of Mr. Pratt's memorandum of June 19 with reference to certain material required at the Indian residential school, Shubenacadie, N. S.

With regard to this inquiry I would point out that purchase requisition dated June 15 was forwarded to the Purchasing Agent.

In addition to the items mentioned on this requisition there will also be required 20,000 roofing shingles. As soon as this Branch obtains definite information regarding the size of these another requisition will be forwarded to the Purchasing Branch.

On our requisition of June 15 it was stated that the materials requested were required for the erection of an addition to the barn at the Shubenacadie residential school. The labour is being supplied by the school management without cost to the Department.

In reply to that part of your letter of June 15th, concerning the roofing shingles, these shingles are about three feet long and about a foot of depth. The weight is 240 lbs. to the square, or ten foot square. They are made in three weights, and we have asked for the heaviest, on account of such high winds in this locality. They are made by Brantford, and also by Barrett. They are the same as we have on the other barn, and most outbuildings. The cost is about 8.50 - 75 per square.

Hoping that this will clear up any misunderstanding we may have caused,





Lime-Spreading Attachment

MOST soils require an application of limestone to grow either clover or alfalfa successfully. The lime-spreading attachment built especially for the No. 4-A all-steel manure spreader provides an economical and convenient way to spread limestone in quantities up to 5 1/2 tons per acre.



The lime-spreading attachment is easy to attach and just as easy to operate. There are two revolving disks with fins set side by side underneath the rear end of the spreader bottom.

When the spreader is in motion the disks rotate and spread the lime toward the rear and sides—an approximate spread of 12 feet. The steel retarder rack included as part of this attachment is placed at the rear of the spreader, and steel prongs help to break up the lime before it is dropped on the disks below.

The endgate is equipped with hangers which slip over the top of the steel retarder rack and hold the endgate in place while the lime is being hauled to the field. The No. 4-A manure spreader has a capacity of two tons of limestone per load.

Endgate Attachment for Semiliquid Manure

The liquid portion of the manure is the most valuable part and should be carefully conserved. The endgate attachment is used in hilly sections to prevent waste when hauling semiliquid manure to the fields. It can be conveniently raised from the seat while the spreader is in operation. A spreader box rear pan for catching the semiliquid manure may be used either with the endgate attachment or alone where a minimum of litter is used.

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


