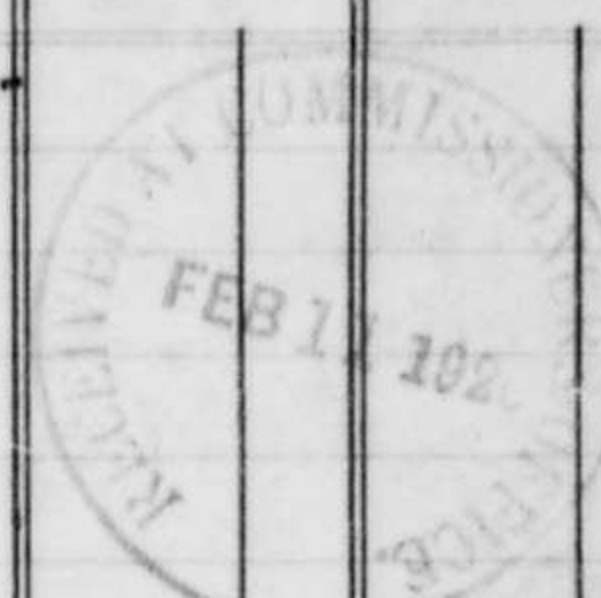

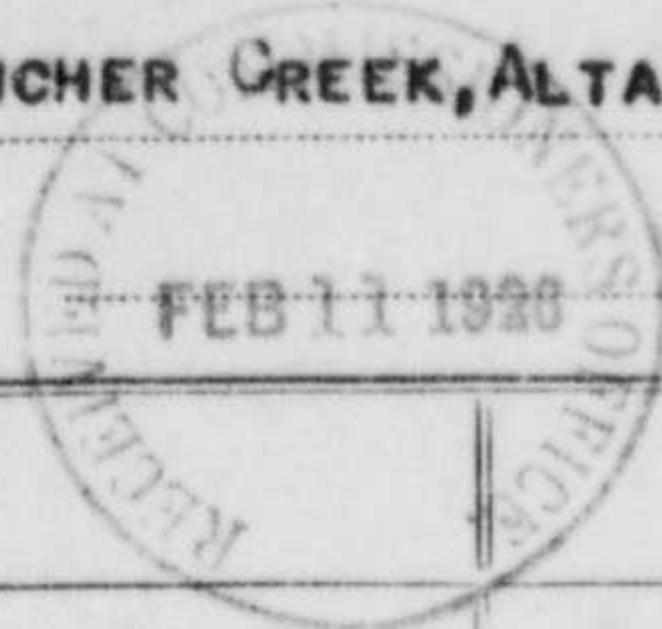

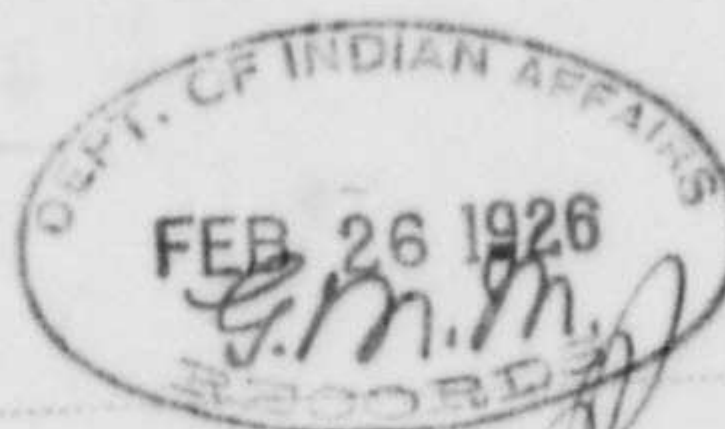

RE PEIGAN CHURCH OF ENGLAND SCHOOL.

Reverend Canon Gould called at the office this morning, and we discussed the plans of the new Peigan Church of England School. Canon Gould expressed himself as being favourable to the layout that has been provided for the Peigan Roman Catholic School with the following changes.

BASEMENT. Staff room at rear of building to be changed to dairy, and the staff dining room, adjacent to boys' recreation room to be changed to staff bedroom.

A partition to be erected in the boys' recreation room in order to place the door leading to the boys' toilet in the corridor.

GROUND. Chapel to be removed to first floor, to the space now occupied by the Sisters' dormitory and community. Space on ground floor occupied by Chapel to be arranged to provide living quarters for Principal, and to consist of a bathroom, three bedrooms, dining room and living room, with direct entrance from the outside.

In view of the possibility of a new School being erected on the Peigan Reserve for our Society during the coming fiscal year, I beg to state that if action be taken for the building operations to be completed before the end of the current calendar year, it will be a very great help to our Society if the following items of equipment were provided immediately, in order that steps may be taken by the school management towards the development of the farming and gardening side of the work:-

- 4 horses.
- Harness for the same.
- 1 John Deer 2 furrow 12 inch gang plow.
- 1 Disc Seed Drill.
- 1 Duckfoot 4 horse Cultivator.
- 1 3 section Drag Harrow.
- 1 Wagon and Box complete.

Should the site chosen by your Department contain land which has already been broken, the school management would be able, if provided with equipment immediately, to raise sufficient oats, hay, vegetables, etc., to meet the needs of the institution for the first winter. Our Society would provide the seed, but implements such as a mower, hay rake and binder would be required when the time for harvesting operations comes.



Reverend Sir:

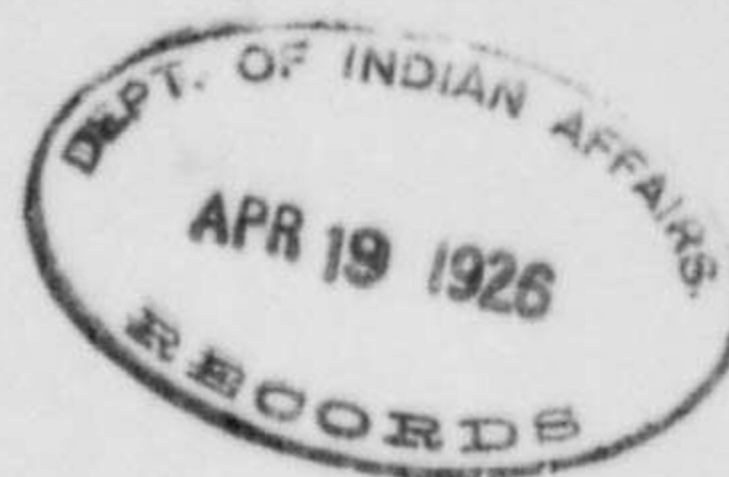

I beg to forward herewith and recommend for payment, Peigan Agency voucher #64, in favour of B. V. Sill, representing work performed in an effort to clean out the old well near the site selected for the new Church of England school on the reserve. It was first decided to endeavour to clean out this old well which it was thought might be used as water had been definitely located at that spot. However, so much debris had accumulated in the well that the effort was abandoned. I reported by telegram dated the 13th inst., the securing of an adequate flow of 600 gals. per hour in the new well. In a subsequent report, however, it has been ascertained that the present actual flow is 1200 gals. per hour.

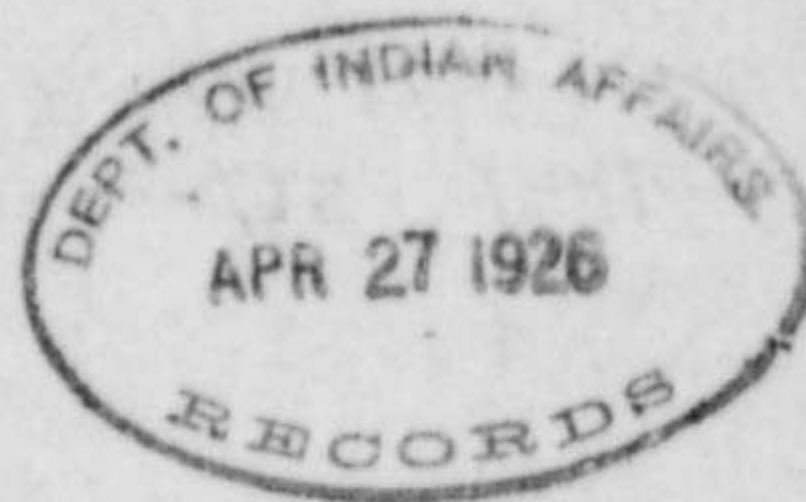
