

Re Teachers' Residence Shubenacadie Indian Residential School, Shubenacadie N. S.

Further to our memorandum of June 3rd you are advised that we are in receipt of a letter from W. C. Wetmore, Ltd., Plumbing and Heating Contractor at the above, in which the characteristics of the circulating pump installed in the Teachers' Residence are given. Mr. Morris, Superintendent of Indian Agencies for the Maritimes and Mr. Johnson, Assistant to Indian Agent Rice, reported verbally that this pump sets up a vibration and noise and is unsatisfactory. We are unable to deal with this matter at this time and it will be necessary for one of our Engineers to see this pump in operation before a recommendation can be made.

It is expected that an officer from this Division will be visiting Shubenacadie sometime in September for the purpose of carrying out the final inspection of the work now being installed at the Residential School. At the time this visit is made the matter referred to can be cleared up and upon receiving our officer's report you will be further advised.



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



Re: INDIAN DAY SCHOOL,
Shubenacadie, N. S.

Before the commencement of the next Academic Year it is desirable that the following items be considered:-

(1) The present heating system is inadequate for this School and it was understood that the present unit was to be replaced by a Hot Water System. We have received some materials from the Mount Pleasant Air Port which can be used in this conversion, however, the Furnace is not here and not nearly enough pipe to complete the job.

(2) You will no doubt remember that last Fall an account-able advance was received at this Office to effect the necessary repairs to the outside lavatories. Due to the fact that an early winter set in the amount of frost in the ground made it impossible to attempt this work. The money advanced was returned at the end of the fiscal year. It is felt that this work should be proceeded with at once so that a convenient sanitary set-up can be erected.

It is proposed to construct a large cribbed well under the present buildings which will be removed to a new site in order that a better play ground can be provided. From this well irrigation pipe will lead to a suitable disposal bed. The front of the present buildings when moved to their new

location will be suitably camouflaged with lattis work to create good display.

(3) It is absolutely necessary that a suitable play ground be completed this year. The lavratories are to be moved from their present site to allow for this work, but although some ground will be gained much work will have to be done behind the School and on the North side. Most of this work can be done with the Agency Tractor and Truck, but some other expenditure for equipment Etc., will be necessary to bring the play ground up to the standard desired.

May these requests receive favourable consideration and could we be advised at your earliest convenience your decision and recommendations in respect to these matters.

We have just received a letter from Superintendent Rice which reads in part as follows:

"The present heating system is inadequate for this school and it was understood that the present unit was to be replaced by a Hot Water System. We have received some materials from the Mount Pleasant Air Port which can be used in this conversion, however, the furnace is not here and not nearly enough pipe to complete the job."

We do not appear to have any correspondence on file regarding the change in the heating system at the above school. Possibly you have some information available and if so, we would be pleased to hear from you. This matter should be allowed to stand until your officer visits Shubenacadie which you state in your memorandum of July 8th, will be early in September.







Re: Four-roomed Day School, Shubenacadie
Indian Agency, Nova Scotia.

In your notation on Mr. Hoey's memorandum dated the 11th instant, in connection with the above, you ask to be advised.

We may say in this connection that the school was the first unit, of what now is a substantial development at the Shubenacadie Agency. At the time of construction no water or power services were available, and as a consequence only a gravity hot air system could be installed.

From Mr. Hoey's memorandum, it is now apparent that the Indian Affairs Branch have decided to install electric wiring and hot water heating, from a design this Division prepared and installed in a similar building at the Eskasoni Indian Agency in Nova Scotia.

The work is evidently to be carried out by employees of the Agency staff and local tradesmen under the direction of Mr. George Johnson, Caretaker Grade 5, with salvaged materials, to which will be added a new boiler and other materials required.

In accordance with Mr. Hoey's request copies of the blueprints and specifications as used for the Eskasoni project were handed to Mr. E. Morris, Acting Superintendent of Indian Agencies for the Maritime Provinces, through whom the operations will be processed.

While Mr. Hoey gives assurance that the drawings and specifications will be followed, this Branch should assume no responsibility for the installations or their operation.

There seems to be some understanding as to the amount of surplus plumbing equipment which is available at this Agency for the job in question. As you are possibly aware we did receive certain amount of equipment by box-car during the past winter from Mount Pleasant Airport, P.E.I.

Further we dispatched our truck to Lennox Island on August 9th last to take up the balance of the surplus equipment there. Although Mr. Daley was not on hand to supervise the loading it is understood that we obtained all the surplus equipment that was available.

We possibly have enough radiators on hand at the present time to complete the job, however, a considerable amount of pipes will have to be purchased. We have written Mr. Daley sometime ago requesting information as to whether we can expect to receive anything further in the line of plumbing equipment from his Agency. To date we have not received a reply and it is felt that in view of the short time that is left before the opening of school, this matter should be drawn to your attention so that we can obtain further instructions from you as to what action is to be taken.
