PB CALGARY, ALTA., July 14th, 1936.

Sir:

I beg to bring to your attention that a gentleman was in the office here this morning, and he informed me he had been down around the old Dunbow School and had noticed that the grave yard there was being trampled over by cattle, and they had knocked all the crosses down, &c., and that it was in terrible shape. He also brought to my attention that there was some equipment in some of the buildings such as beds, school desks, furniture and other equipment too numerous to mention. Does this belong to the Department, for if it does, it would be an easy matter to give it out to some of the Indians; or have the Department anything to do with it?

The informant is a man of good standing in Calgary, and no doubt his statement is correct.

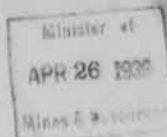



I have received your memorandum of October 20th, in which you ask to be advised what land is covered by the second title mentioned in letter dated December 19, 1912, being duplicate certificate of title issued July 15, 1895, and of record here under No. 364.

This duplicate certificate of title reads in part as follows:

"This is to certify that Her Majesty, the Queen, is now the owner of an estate in fee simple in possession of and in that part of the west half of Section number eleven (11) in Township number twenty-one (21) in Range number thirteen (13) West of the Second (2nd) Meridian, in the Provisional District of Assiniboia, in the Northwest Territories of the Dominion of Canada, which may be described as follows ..... containing by admeasurement Nine and Three-tenths (9 3/10) acres of land, more or less, etc."

If it is your wish to obtain a description by metes and bounds of the parcel referred to, this can be furnished on request.
