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

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



I beg to make requisition for
lumber:

The flooring of the stalls in the Horse Stable is entirely worn through and must be replaced. It will require 800 lumber ft. for this purpose. The best price we can get for the lumber suitable for this purpose is at \$48.00 per M, which amounts to \$38.40.



Hockey is our main winter recreation. Our boys are becoming quite proficient and frequently play with other teams in this vicinity. We need lumber for a 2 foot fence around the skating rink. In looking into the matter we find a 12-inch board, undressed, which is a full inch in width, to be the most serviceable material we can secure. It requires 1,000 ft. to make this necessary fence 2 feet high around the rink. The stakes can be cut in the bush and drive them in the ground for our uprights to which we nail the boards. The cost of this lumber is \$45.00 per M.

This makes a total bill of \$83.40.

We will appreciate it very much if these two items of lumber can be supplied to us by the Department.

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

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



Dear Sir,

I have received a letter from the Rev. J. A. Doyle, Principal of the Brandon Indian Residential School, in which he points out that the windows of the school do not fit and make it almost impossible to heat the building. He states that some of the windows have almost 7/16 inch play when moved from side to side. He recommends that the bronze weather stripping, which is nailed on the window frame and presses against the sash, be purchased and points out that it will require 500 ft., at an approximate cost of \$16.00 F.O.B. Winnipeg.
