Dear Sir:-

On May 1st the Rev. O. B. Strapp, Principal of Mount Elgin School advised me that the main drain coupled with the septic tank laundry in barns was blocked up and on visiting the school to inspect the drain I find that at the outlet, where the drain enters into the River Thames one third of a mile distant from the school buildings, over 150 feet of the drain has caved in and the outlet tiles are all broken. This tile drain is 15 feet deep at its outlet and until it is dug out it will not be possible to find where the stoppage occurs and it would be necessary to commence at the outlet and work backwards.

The drain was put in many years ago and Mr. Strapp does not know of its construction and it may be possible that it is a 10" field tile or a wooden box drain. This can only be found out when the drain is opened.

In view of the depth of the drain it will be expensive to open the same but it should be done at once so that water and refuse will not back up into the school buildings through the septic tank. As the overflow from the septic tank, the drains from the main building, the barns and the cultivated fields all empty into this outlet, it is the opinion of Mr. Strapp and myself that the septic tank outlet should be on a separate drain and carried to the river at its closest point from the tank which would greatly shorten the length of such outlet and it is suggested that the Department send an Official at an early date to investigate and report as a large expenditure will be involved in any case.

Pending your instructions I will at once engage men to open this drain to try and eliminate the present blockage and will pay wages from our Welfare Account to be reimbursed at a later date from the Department.



Dear Sir:

With further reference to the repair of the main drain at Mount Elgin Indian Residential School I would enclose a requisition for materials necessary to make these repairs, the estimated cost being in the vicinity of \$175.00. The estimated cost of labour would be \$75.00 and to date I have expended from Welfare Funds at this office the sum of \$17.50 to open this drain pending your instructions regarding repair.

The outlet for a distance of one hundred and twenty feet had completely caved in and the tile were all broken and it will be necessary to relay this drain with new tile for that distance and as the ditch is fifteen feet deep some lumber is needed for shoring to protect the workmen engaged to prevent accidents from cave in.

It is my intention at the outlet to imbed twenty feet of sewer tile in cement to prevent any breakage from frost and to construct a cement apron as well. The gravel will be provided by the school without charge.

Kindly send forward funds for payment of wages and instructions as to purchase of materials so that this work could be done during July when less water will be pouring through this drain.



It is still my opinion that a Departmental Engineer at the first opportunity should be asked to make a report on the entire drainage system at this School as I am informed there are eight drains from the main building, annex and laundry, entering this tile previous to it passing through the sceptic tank which must affect the proper working of the tank and the whole drainage system should be adjusted so that the toilet pipe-lines only enter the sceptic tank to ensure 100 % efficiency from the sceptic tank.




Dear Sir:

Please be advised that some damage was done to the machinery in the laundry building at Mount Elgin Residential School which will make necessary an expenditure of \$27.50 for repairs.

The main drive belt in some manner got caught on the large drive pulley and tore 20 feet of drive shaft, brackets, etc. from the ceiling and this drive shaft will have to be replaced and will cost in the vicinity of \$18.00 as the one torn down was too light and is bent beyond repair. Three bearings at \$1.50 each are also needed and the cost of welding broken parts will run over \$5.00. The main drive pulley which is 30 inches in diameter is quite badly bent and it may be possible to have it repaired, failing which it will be necessary to buy a new pulley.

The Staff at the school will do all work except the welding and I have instructed the Principal to procure the shaft from the firm of James Wright, London, Ontario, so that this laundry may be placed in operation as soon as possible.
