I have received a letter from Mr John M. Kelly, Boiler Inspector, of Port Arthur, Ontario, informing me he has inspected a 36" x 8000 H.R.T. Boiler at the Port Arthur Shipbuilding Co plant at Port Arthur, and he understands the boiler is for the new Kenora School. (e.l.)

As regards this boiler, we have received complaints from both the McIntosh and Sioux Lookout Schools that the furnaces that take 3 foot wood are very inconvenient, as all wood used in this part of the district is cut in 4 foot lengths and if the fire boxes do not take 4 foot wood, there is much wastage.

Would it not be convenient to get larger fireboxes and so eliminate this wastage?

You no doubt remember the Sioux Lookout School furnace doors have had to be altered.

Mr Kelly will make his usual inspection of all the school boilers in accordance with Section 57 of Shop, Factory, and Office building Act.
