



Dear Sir:

Please find enclosed Agent's report on a visit of inspection made to Mount Elgin Residential School on February 8th and at the time of this visit the Rev. Principal drew my attention to leaks in the roof of the main building due to broken and missing slates and he estimates in the vicinity of fifty new slates are necessary at forty cents each to make these repairs.

The Principal also reported the need of replacing a considerable portion of the Valley eaves-troughing on the main building which eavestroughing, due to age, has rusted and is full of holes and the water is doing considerable damage to the building and should be renewed. The conductor pipes on both the wings of the school proper are missing, having been broken off and the pipe is full of holes and needs replacing as it is doing harm to the brick work and the school is losing rain water that they generally use in the laundry. The actual cost of repairing eaves-troughing and conductor pipes is uncertain and only a tinsmith could estimate accurately. The Principal considers repairs could be made if \$175.00 were made available.

The brass pounding and weaving work is going ahead very successfully and the pupils enjoy this and other manual training work and have shown a marked aptitude by the finished articles they have made.

Dear Sir:

I am in receipt of your letter of the 9th instant with reference to your recent inspection of the Mount Elgin Indian residential school. Owing to lack of funds it is not possible at the present time to authorize the expenditure required to repair the eaves troughing. Please bring this matter to my attention early in April when the matter will receive further consideration.

While it is noted from the first paragraph of your letter that the new slates for the roof would only cost approximately \$20.00 I presume that there would be considerable expense for labour. As our funds for the current fiscal year are completely assigned I regret that it will not be possible to favourably consider this expenditure now.


