Roads to have a grade of not more than one (1) inch per foot
 from ditches at side to crown in centre. To be constructed of
 earth and finished with gravel. First course of gravel to be coarse
 gravel and four (4) inches in depth. Road to be sprinkled and rolled
 after earth grade is obtained and after both the first and second
 courses of gravel.



I would state that there are 700 cedar posts to be purchased.

The fence for the Demonstration Farm and for the Provincial Training School was erected by experts. This is one of the best wire fences manufactured and only an expert can see that it is properly erected as all corner posts and gate posts are set in cement and if it is not properly stretched and well erected half of the life of the fence is gone.



I beg to inform the Department that some 300 feet of fencing in front of the new Indian School in course of construction, was left unfenced. The materials for the school are all on the ground and as there is no danger of the fence being destroyed by careless teamsters we can have it erected. It is best to have it constructed now as the frost will not be out of the ground before June and the fence will need to be up in early spring to keep stock out.

I would ask the Department if they will kindly send me specifications for the four brick pillars which will form the two entrances. These were to be stone buttments, brick center and stone caps if I remember Mr. C.D.Chene's suggestions correctly.

I shall be very pleased to hear from the Department as we cannot depend on ^{warm} weather after October the 20th.
