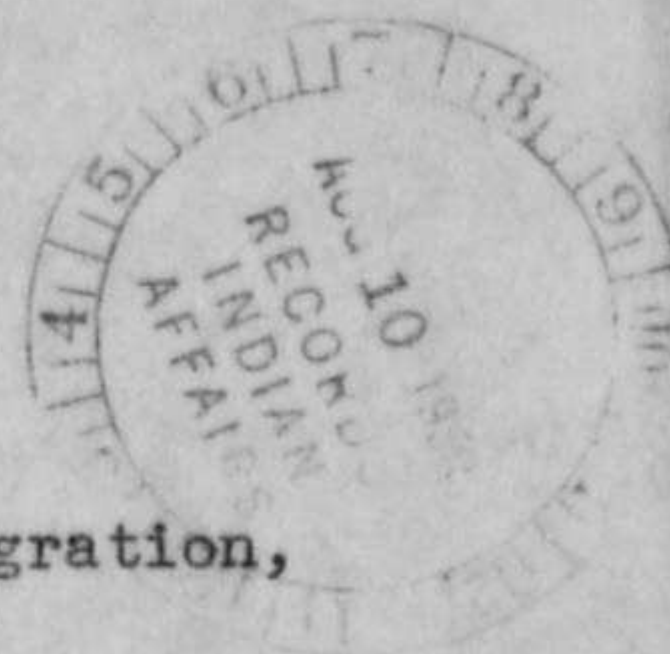

Reverend Sir:

When an official of our Department visited your school on the 26th ultimo he mentioned carelessness in the maintenance of the barn, namely that the doors are sinking and sprung, and that no attempt had been made to repair them; that the stanchion in the cow barn is broken, and was left lying in the stall along with other broken material; that the lean-to on the east side of the blacksmith's shop is badly in need of minor repairs and the roof is sinking; that very little effort would be required to repair the roof by jacking it up and re-bracing it; that the school yard is generally in an untidy condition, with bricks and bits of broken plank lying here and there; that a roller jack which had apparently been used to jack up the tractor was left lying in the yard and not put away after the job of repairing the tractor had been completed; and that on his visit to your school on July 18th he mentioned to you the matter of shavings and rubble lying about the combination work shop and engine room, and pointed out to you the fire hazard thus created, but on the occasion of his next visit, more shavings and rubble were evident, and no attempt had been made to clean it away.

I would ask that you consider it your duty to see that the school premises are kept tidy; that all minor building repairs are given attention promptly before major repairs become necessary; and that any rubbish lying around which increases the fire hazard must be promptly cleared away and kept cleared away.

Please acknowledge receipt of this letter, and advise me when these matters have been given attention.

Re: Onion Lake Indian Residential School Barn (E.C.)

As per your instructions I visited the above mentioned school on July 26th, and, in checking the boiler described by Mr. Davis in his requisition for supplies, I find that I am unable to obtain any further information from the boiler plates. It is described as a McClary's Farmer Boiler, No. 30. From the information I have obtained from different sources this type of boiler was originally made for scalding hogs on the farm. I would suggest that a small boiler be purchased and installed in the furnace room, the steam and hot water be piped to the laundry, and the three formerly mentioned boilers be done away with.

Barn - the repairs to the roof from the fire had been completed but there is evidence of much carelessness in the maintenance of the rest of the building. The doors are sinking and sprung, and no attempt has been made to repair them. One stanchion in the cow barn is broken, and was left lying in the stall, along with other broken material which has not been piled, but more or less thrown into this stall.

A lean-to on the east end of the blacksmith's shop is badly in need of minor repairs and the roof is sinking. It would require very little effort on the part of the Principal to have this roof repaired (jacked and re-braced). All buildings at the school, with the exception of a blacksmith's shop, are in immediate need of minor repairs.

The school barn yard is generally in an untidy condition

with bricks and bit of broken.....

with bricks and bits of broken plank lying here and there. I also found that a roller jack which had apparently been used to jack up the tractor was left lying in the yard where they had finished with it, and the tractor, or whatever machine was being repaired, had been moved away.

On a visit to this school on July 18th I drew Father St. Pierre's attention to the shavings and rubble lying about the combination work shop and engine room, and pointed out to him the fire hazard this created, but on my visit on the 24th I found there were more shavings and rubble, and no attempt had been made to clean it. It is evident that Father St. Pierre is not too fire conscious, as I also found a two-gallon can partly filled with gasoline, and one of the caps on the can was missing. This can is kept in the engine room in the barn close to the engine used to operate the milking machine. This is the same engine that is supposed to have started the fire in the barn earlier this year. I pointed out these things to Mr. J.A. Davis, Superintendent, Meadow Lake Agency, and he informed me that he had, on several previous occasions, mentioned some of these things to Father St. Pierre, but had received no reply regarding any of them.

put I would recommend that another fire proof building of sheet steel or some other fire proof material be built 10 or 12 ft. away from the barn, and the engine that is now in the barn be put in this building.


With reference to Department letter dated May 26th, 1950, File 659-5(E1), in connection with the requisition for 3 McClary Farmer Boilers, No. 30, for the Onion Lake R.C. Residential School, I have to say that Mr. D.N. Morrison, Supervisor of Construction, examined the boilers on the 26th ultimo, and I quote from his report:

"As per your instructions I visited the above mentioned school on July 26th, and, in checking the boiler described by Mr. Davis in his requisition for supplies, I find that I am unable to obtain any further information from the boiler plates. It is described as a McClary's Farmer Boiler, No. 30. From the information I have obtained from different sources this type of boiler was originally made for scalding hogs on the farm. I would suggest that a small boiler be purchased and installed in the furnace room, the steam and hot water be piped to the laundry, and the three formerly mentioned boilers be done away with."

It will be noted that Mr. Morrison recommends that a small boiler be purchased and installed in the furnace room to replace the three Farmer boilers to supply hot water for the laundry.

If the Department agrees to this proposal I shall have a requisition prepared and forwarded as a substitute for the requisition forwarded with my letter of February 10th, 1950.

I am enclosing Mr. Morrison's report on his visit to that school, and a copy of my letter to the Reverend Principal.


Dear Father Plourde:

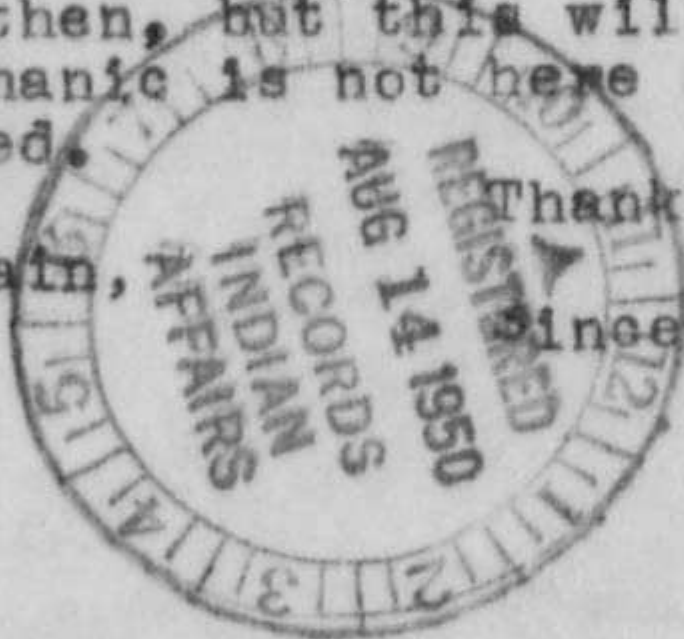
Dear Mr. Neary:

We wish to express our most sincere thanks to the Officials of the Department of Indian Affairs for the Globelite Batteries which were just received for our electric plant. These will be installed as soon as we find time to do so. I wish to assure that special attention will be given to take proper care of them and that we will carry out the recommendations made by the Supervisor of Construction.

^{about} Although there are a few points for us to be more careful I wish to mention that you have, in some way, been misinformed concerning the use of a McCormack-Deering tractor to supply power to drive the generator for charging batteries, as this has not been done since we have the Fairbanks-Morse Diesel Unit. It is true that we did have some trouble with the generator, but we have been without electricity for two months, using gas and oil lamps for lighting purposes. The only use that was made of the tractor was to operate the laundry machine and drier by placing a belt directly on the pulley at the end of this machine, so, the tractor had nothing to do with the electric plant.

I have been informed also that the mechanic did increase the voltage by advancing the Rehostat but this was done after the motor starter had been replaced on the Fairbanks-Morse Diesel engine, as we still had trouble with it then, but this will not be done again and besides, this mechanic is not here anymore, A more experienced man has been hired.

Have done considerable interviewing with a number of contractors trying to get someone interested in the above repair job on the said school.

The Miner Construction Company sent their foreman out and he checked it over and phoned this morning stating that they would not care to submit a bid for the contract but would be prepared to do the work on a cost plus basis. Their foreman is of the opinion that some of the lumber under the roof will have to be repaired and they do not care to make an estimate on it until they had stripped the roof.

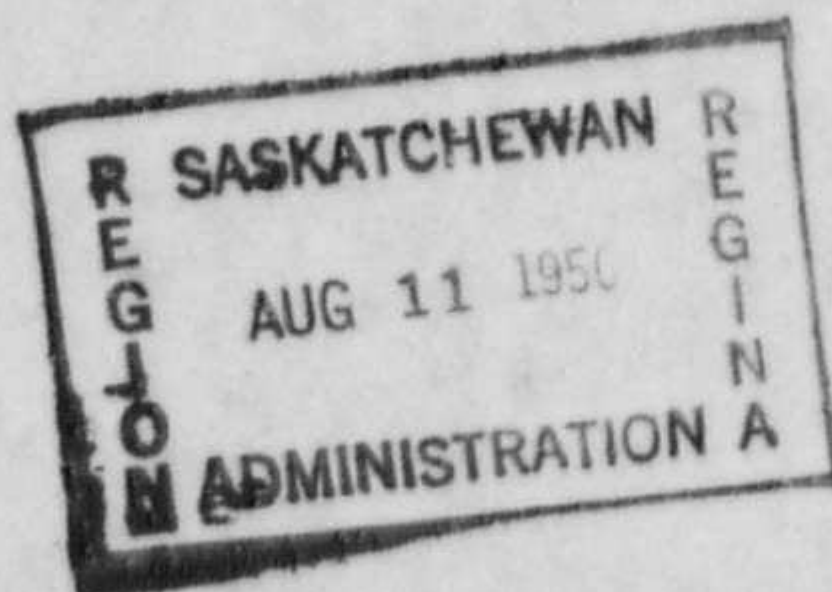
I interviewed a Mr. Sneider of St. Walburg who does considerable contract work in the way of building schools, etc. He checked over this Residential School and phoned me yesterday stating that he has all the work he can handle this year and is not interested in putting in a bid on that job.

Enclosed please find an offer from E.M. Cleve Construction of Lloydminster, Sask., in the amount of \$6,794.00 which you will note he has itemized.

I had heard that Father St. Pierre had interviewed a contractor from North Battleford regarding putting in a bid for this work but the Reverend Father tells me that this is not the case.

Would recommend that the Cleve Construction offer receive your consideration.
