



Dear Mr Olson,

We have received recently an order from the Man. Text Bureau but an error has been made in either ordering or forwarding same.

About fifteen days ago, or more, we have received Arithmetic Work Books for our grades three and four. "Reids" and sufficiently. Again last week another order cam in from the Man. Text Bureau and 36 "Opportunity" Arithmetic work books were sent in for grade four, but none for grade seven or eight.

May we return grade four Work Books and request 16 Arithmetis Work Books for grade seven. We would prefer the "Reids". Four Arithmetic Work Books for grade eight would be sufficient.

If the "Key" to these work books cannot be supplied as we have asked may we return all our "Opportunity Work Books" and exchange these for the "Reids", as we have the Answers to these.

I have also asked for 3 doz. New Canadian Geographics, ours date from 1925. Two wars since have made quite an alteration in map work. Perhaps the matter was overlooked. May I ask you to see about the latter.







The principal of the school has been contacted and he advises that in passed years the supply of black-board chalk, pencils, scribblers and erasers were never sufficient from the Department and some of these supplies were purchased at their own expense. He still would like to receive the chalk as ordered and will you kindly substantially increase the pencil order. It is quite obvious that seventy-two pencils is insufficient for a residential school with an enrollment sometimes as high as one hundred and thirty-two pupils.
