Re: Sewage disposal Cecilia Jeffrey
Indian Residential School, Kenora, Ont.

I am in receipt of your memorandum of June 17 enclosing report of Mr. Gow relative to the above sewage disposal system.

I approve of an expenditure not exceeding \$300.00 in order to improve the sewage system at the Cecilia Jeffrey School.

Included in the amount of \$61,400.00 transferred to your Branch at the beginning of the current fiscal year was an item of \$1,400.00 for some work that we intended to do at the Port Frances Residential School. However, it has been decided not to proceed with this work and we recently approved of an expenditure of \$1,145.00 at the Alert Bay School. This leaves a balance of \$255.00 still available.

It is likely that other work will arise within the next month or so which will require our transferring funds to your Branch and at that time we will include the balance of \$45.00 required in connection with the sewage disposal system at the Cecilia Jeffrey School.

Dear Miss Lang:

No doubt you will recall that during our conference with Mr. Phelan last June, that he raised the question re: the locking of our dormitory doors at night. Mr. Phelan stated on that occasion that the Agent had misread the Department's instructions and that it was the doors leading onto fire escapes that the Department wished unlocked. He further stated that it was not practical to have the dormitory doors unlocked.

The Indian Agent here insists that I unlock the doors and at the same time every other school in his agency have the doors locked. I have visited quite a number of Indian Schools and in every one visited the doors are locked.

It seems to me a deep injustice that a ruling should be made to apply to one school and other schools are left free to do as they wish. I must have the boards' support in this matter, otherwise the agent is going to force me to throw our dormitory doors wide open, with boys sleeping at one end of the corridor and girls at the other end with nothing but the open corridor between.

The members of staff feel that it is an impossible situation and some have even said that they would rather resign than work under those conditions. The principals of Brandon, Birtle, Portage la Prairie, and Sioux Lookout all say it is impossible. I hope you will do everything possible to have this ruling vetoed.

The Department is in receipt of another letter from the Principal of the Cecilia Jeffrey Indian Residential School in which he states that you are still insisting that all the dormitory doors remain unlocked at night.

Please note the instructions contained in circular letter of February 10, 1936 a copy of which is enclosed. The instructions contained in this letter were that the only doors that the Department required be unlocked during the night were those leading from the dormitories to the fire escapes. It is felt that if the Principal and yourself had carefully read the contents of circular letter of February 10 there would have been no necessity for all the correspondence that we have had in connection with this matter.

Dear Sir,

Referring to the Superintendent of Welfare and Training's letter # 129-3-5 of 9th instant, re locking Dormitory doors at night at the Cecilia Jeffrey Indian Residential School.

I have given the Principal of the School, no other instructions as regarding locking doors, than are contained in Departmental letters and circulars, and the only doors we have referred to in any way are those leading from the dormitory to the fire escapes.

I have not taken this matter up with the Principal for some time, except that on the 20th of July, I went to the School with the Kenora Fire Chief, to see what he could suggest as regards a covering over the fire escapes, to prevent the fall of ice on them, he then mentioned about the children getting out, to the Principal, and it was suggested a hook and eye could be put on the doors so the children could if absolutely necessary push them open from inside, and I understood this is what the Principal intended to do, as is done at some of our other schools.

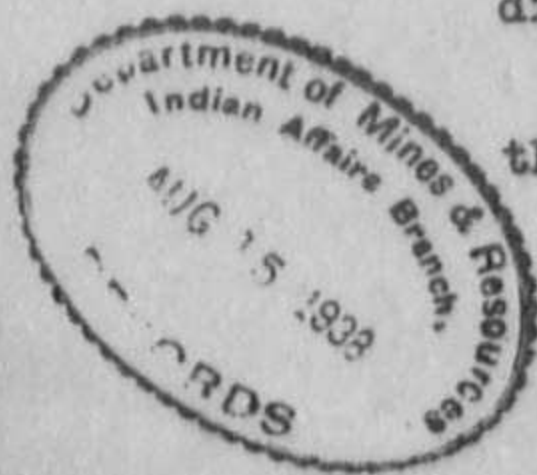
The Principal always seems to be offended when I give him any instructions, although I give them in as diplomatic a manner as possible, knowing he is very touchy.

He is the only Principal, I have where there are these difficulties.

in connection with the school.

He pointed out that the mattresses in both
dormitories were in bad condition and a number should
be renewed. Since then, I have received a report from
Mr. Edwards, the Indian Agent, in this connection and
he recommends that seventy five new mattresses be supplied.
He points out that some now in use should be destroyed,
as they are badly worn and unfit for further use.

If funds are available, I would recommend
that the 75 mattresses requested be supplied.



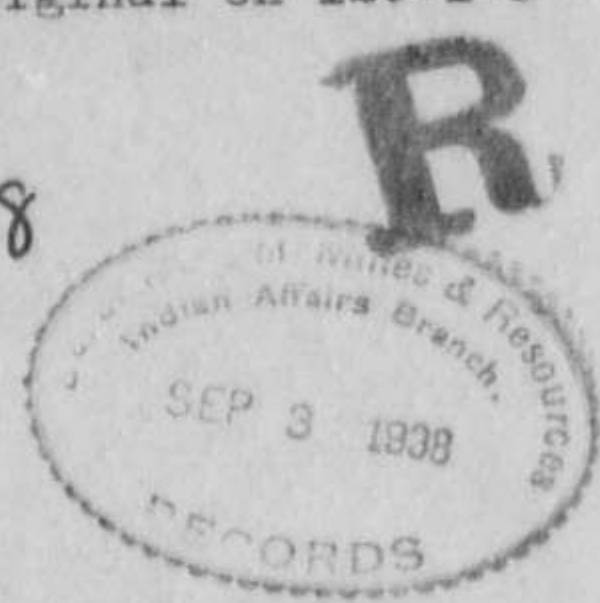

He also recommends a manhole be fitted in the cold water storage tank at the Cecilia Jeffrey School; whilst in Winnipeg he called at the Manitoba Bridge and Iron Works Company and explained what was required so a man could get into the tank and clean it out. I am asked to request the Principal to send on the stamping on tanks, etc. so they will be able to supply what is required. I am asking Mr. Byers to do this and send me a copy so we will have the information on file when required. The Inspector says the matter should be attended to at once as he noticed much deposit accumulated in the tank that already had a manhole, and the storage tank will have much more deposit in it and cannot be cleaned out.

Dear Mr. Hoey:

Since writing you regarding a night-watchman for the Birtle school, I understand that in the other schools a watchman is allowed for seven months at a rate of \$40.00 per month. At the Cecilia Jeffrey school, which is the largest in the agency, only \$30.00 per month is allowed for six months.

In the matter of expense for bringing in the children, we have never received any allowance. At Cecilia Jeffrey our principal has very kindly brought in children going to other schools because they happened to be in the district where he was collecting children. For this he has received nothing, and a claim for bringing in our own children made by Mr. Byers was not allowed.

Our Society has always been very generous in its contribution to Indian work and we feel that we should have the same allowances as other churches. May I suggest that these matters be considered and a fair arrangement made?


Dear Miss Lang:

With reference to your letter of the 20th instant regarding the amount allowed for the night watchman at the Cecilia Jeffrey Residential School I would refer you to my recent letter in connection with the request for a grant for a night watchman at the Birtle School. In providing the funds required for this service it was definitely understood that a grant for a night watchman would only be allowed at those Residential Schools where there was a very serious fire hazard. Two years ago the Principal of the Cecilia Jeffrey School applied to the Department, through Indian Agent Edwards, for a grant for a night watchman and while the Cecilia Jeffrey School cannot be recognized as one in which the fire hazard is serious the Principal stated that he had engaged a night watchman to assist him and it was decided to allow an amount of \$30.00 a month for 6 months. We have always understood that this payment was satisfactory to the Principal.

Some years ago the Department purchased a boat for the use of the Cecilia Jeffrey School. Under these circumstances it was felt that it should not be necessary to make an allowance for the transportation of pupils as they can be carried in the school boat. We have paid small accounts for the transportation of pupils from points which the school boat could not reach.

Referring to your memorandum of the 24th of June last regarding the above, we are now advised by Mr. Gow that work for this season has been completed. As regards the work done, the following is quoted from Mr. Gow's letter for your information:

"The work carried out on this project consisted mostly of re-building up the disposal bed. As you are aware, this disposal bed was constructed early in the winter of 1937 during very severe frosty weather with the result that the ground was frozen and the job not properly finished. It was found necessary to dig up a considerable number of rows of tile, relay the same, reconstruct with denser material the borders of the disposal bed and add gravel and etc. to portions that had been washed away.

"The work carried out this summer is not expected to eliminate the trouble being experienced with the sewage disposal system at this school. The nature of the soil and the over-loading of the septic tank creates a condition where a disposal bed cannot be made to work satisfactorily. Accordingly, it is anticipated that more trouble will be experienced with this disposal bed and it was for this reason that we did not care to make further expenditures during the present season."

You will recall that an amount not exceeding \$300.00 was approved for this work, but according to Mr. Gow's statement of expenditure, only \$153.74 was actually expended. The reason limiting the work done this season to this amount being given in the last paragraph quoted above from Mr. Gow's report.
