" Since the Department is having the T.B. Test for all children at considerable expense, we suppose that it is not possible that there will be any funds for teeth and tonsils. If we can we expect to do the same as we did last year with vacation expenses, that is, spend it on teeth or tonsils, or possibly some for both."

Attached please find report of Dr. McInnis concerning children who have been bothered with running ears. With the exception of Wm. Gehue, Barney Clare, and Joe Knockwood, the Doctor attributes the trouble to enlarged tonsils.

We also have a number with decayed teeth. Some had not been attended to last fall when the dentist was here and others have come to the school since that time.

If this ear trouble is caused by tonsils, would it not be possible to have these cases looked after without delay. There would not be more than six at most.

Since the local dentist is to do the work, I do not suppose that it will make any difference if it is done in small lots or not. If you have arranged a schedule of rates I believe the dentist would rather take them in small groups.

Will you please let me know what I may do in regard to the tonsils and teeth?

In reply to your letter of November 15 I may say that dental attention for 31 children would normally require the time of a dentist for about one full day, or a little more. The fee for a day's dental clinic is \$30.00 but the Department will allow up to \$40.00 if necessary. You may have the work done as found most convenient, but I would suggest that you get the dentist to come to the school for a clinic, or alternatively make his time available at his office for at least one clear day.

If there are not more than six children for removal of tonsils, the best method would seem to be to take them in one group to the hospital at Halifax. This plan is proposed on the assumption that they can be admitted to the Victoria General Hospital under the usual arrangement with that institution. Individual consent of the parents is required before the operations are undertaken.

The dental work may be done by Doctor D. O. McLeod of Shubenacadie.

In reply to your letter of November 22nd, concerning teeth and tonsils:

Doctor McLeod, the local Dentist, made a start at the teeth, and he has agreed to do the thirty one children for Forty Dollars. So far we have taken twelve to his office, consuming two after-noon office hours. Three of these twelve have to return, as they have so many teeth to be extracted, that it will require an anaesthetic. Doctor McInnis has agreed to go to the Dentist's office to give the anaesthetic. You can readily see that it is going to take more than two full days. This can be partially accounted for, on account of the Dentist's eye trouble, a war disability, which does not permit him to do fast work. However, we hope the work will be cleaned up in about two weeks.

As for tonsils, from our own observation, we felt that there were at least six who required tonsillectomy. When the Doctor examined these six, he continued to examine those who came to the school since the last lot of tonsils were done. To our surprise he has listed twenty-six for tonsils, and three for adenoids. The three for adenoids are of one family, and with the exception of one member of that family, they all had bad cases of bronchial catarrh. Of the twenty six tonsil cases, there is no choice; one is as bad as the other.

Will you please let us know if you have any funds for this work, and if so, what Doctor is to do them?

Enclosed is the statement of Doctor McInnis.
