

EXTRACT FROM REPORT OF MR. INSPECTOR SHANNON,
DATED DECEMBER 4th, 1930, ON HIS INSPECTION OF
THE GEORGIA JEFFREY INDIAN RESIDENTIAL SCHOOL.

The junior classroom is too small for the number of pupils now making use of it. There are 39 pupils in the room approximately 16' x 20'. It is absolutely necessary under such conditions that the ventilation ~~be~~ provide constant change of air. Four Celloglass shields should be provided for the windows in this room.

The following improvements have been suggested:-

- a. The desks should be fastened to slats in groups of three or four to prove the proper alignment when in use, and also to provide freedom of movement for purpose of scrubbing floors.

Sir:

The Public School Inspector, in a report on his inspection of the Cecilia Jeffrey Indian Residential School in December, last, draws attention to the overcrowding in the junior classroom. He states that this room is too small for the number of pupils now making use of it, and that it is absolutely necessary, under such conditions, that the ventilation provide a constant change of air. He recommends that four Celloglass or ordinary glass shields about nine inches high be provided, so that the windows could be opened about an inch or two at the bottom all the time without causing a direct draft on the pupils. You should take this matter up with the Principal and ascertain if it would not be possible to re-arrange the classes with a view to a decrease in the number of pupils using the classroom at one time.

The Inspector also recommends that the desks in the junior classroom be fastened to slats in groups of three or four to provide proper alignment when in use, and also to provide freedom of movement for purpose of scrubbing floors.

In connection with the above recommendations of the Inspector, I have to refer to your letter of the 11th instant, enclosing a communication from the Principal regarding the installing of deflectors for ventilation and fastening the seats to slats. It is noted that at that time the estimate of the cost of having the above work carried out was stated to be \$50. It is considered, however, that if the materials were provided the staff of the school should be able to build deflectors for the windows and fasten the seats to slats. The Department will approve of you arranging to supply the materials required, and, if the school authorities are unable to do all the work, you may arrange for any labour required.

After the above work has been completed, please forward an account, in duplicate, properly certified, covering the material supplied and for any outside labour, if any, in doing the work.
