Dear Sir:-

We have a little matter which we wish you would look into and straighten out for us if possible.

In 1929 under the former Government, we built the Indian Residential School at Lytton, B. C., on which there is owing to us a balance of Eight Hundred Nineteen Dollars and Thirty Cents (\$819.30). To our constant communications to the Indian Department we have received no reply in this matter. They have never definitely refused to pay the bill but merely ignore our correspondence.

The reason for this, we presume, is because the amount of our charges is for extra wages paid to the carpenters on the demand of your Department, by the late Minister, Peter Heenan.

This demand was made on us by the Minister in order to satisfy the request of the Labour Unions in Vancouver. It was in addition to what our men had agreed to work for, and in addition to any wage scale paid in any of the surrounding country within 150 miles of Lytton, where we were doing the work.

Our contract was for wages to be paid according to the scale of the district, and we had taken special care, before figuring the building or entering into the contract with the Department, to ascertain, both in Kamloops and Chilliwack, what the wages of that district and surrounding country were at the time. As a matter of fact we were already paying our carpenters 50 cents more per day than the rate in the district demanded, but the Minister, to satisfy the Vancouver Unions demanded that we pay another 50 cents per day, and this additional amount, which was required of us, is all

for which we are asking remuneration.

Our whole position is set out in our letters which have been sent to your Department and the Department of Indian Affairs; and also in a statement, in your possession, signed by our men showing that the additional 50 cents per day paid to them was in excess of their agreement with us at the time of being hired.

We think we are justly entitled to being remunerated for this additional expenditure, and we ask that you will favour us by giving it your immediate attention, with the hope that you will see us justly dealt with, and that remittance will be forthcoming to us for same.

Dear Sirs:-

Your letter of the 27th ultimo addressed to the Hon. D. J. Montieth, Minister of Labour, Ottawa, evidently was received by the Provincial Department of Labour, Toronto, and redirected to the undersigned at Ottawa. It is observed from your communication that you are claiming from the Department of Indian Affairs the sum of \$819.30, which is stated to represent extra wages paid to carpenters in excess of the prevailing wage on demand of the Honourable Peter Heenan, who was Minister of Labour at the time, for work done on the contract for an Indian school at Lytton, B. C.

In reply may I say that careful consideration has been given to the representations made. Upon going into this question, however, I find that under the labour conditions of your contract the Minister has authority to determine for the purposes of this contract what are the current or fair and reasonable rates of wages, etc. This authority evidently was exercised in the light of information which had reached the Department respecting conditions prevailing in Lytton and vicinity and with the further knowledge that the carpenters over whom this wage dispute arose had been drawn from Vancouver. In view of the authority of the Minister in such matters as herein referred to, it does not appear to the undersigned that this Department can be of assistance to you in this instance. However, as you have intimated in your letter that this claim has already been submitted to the Department of Indian Affairs, for which Department the work was being performed, I am, therefore, transmitting to that Department, for their information, a copy of your letter and of my reply thereto.



Re. Heating Plant, Lytton, B. C.

Dear Sir:

I met Mr. Sjoquist on Monday last, and accompanied by his steam-fitter, we went over the heating plant at Lytton very carefully. We were able to figure out a scheme whereby the steam main and returns from the Utility Building to the Chapel could be run underground, and Mr. Lett was anxious that the space between these two buildings could be used for a playground, and if we had run the main overhead, the piping supports would have been an attraction for the children, as no doubt, they would have practiced their acrobatic stunts on the steam main.

By using the sub-basement in the Chapel, and a pit in the Utility Building 15 x 8 x 5 feet 6" deep, has given us sufficient depth to run the steam main underground, and also to bring the return back dry. This will prevent any possible chance of freezing in the Chapel through lack of firing.

Regarding the chimney, I asked Mr. Sjoquist to make at least an 8" wall on the side next the building, as a precaution against fire, and there was a matter of 300 extra bricks, but this was covered in the price of \$600.00.

The boiler to be used is an Inglis No. 11, and as the water at Lytton is inclined to be of a foamy nature, and steel boilers lack sufficient steam space, I drove down to Vancouver and interviewed the Inglis people, and they agreed to make the boiler 3" higher to give us this extra steam space, and 6" longer to give us an additional heating surface without any additional cost for the boiler.

The new main to the Residence will be installed so that if no heat is required in the School, the fireman will be in a position to shut off the School entirely, and heat the Residence.

The fireman complained to me that he could not keep an equal water line on the boilers. This condition is caused through the use of check valves on the returns between the Hartford connection and the boiler. These check valves are installed according to the British Columbia regulations, and they are of absolutely no value, in fact, they are a cause of trouble, and I suggested to Mr. Sjoquist that he take out the flaps and by doing so, the boilers will retain a steady and equal water line.

I prepared a piping lay-out for the Utility Building, and I also directed the steam-fitter how I wanted this installed.

Before leaving Lytton, bricks and lumber for the chimney and pit were on the job, and the Inglis people were working on the boiler and expected to have it completed in ten days.

As the Department are spending quite a little sum on the above alterations, I believe it would be good business to have a thorough check and tests made on the plant some time towards the middle of January. I would be quite willing to make this report and tests, if you so desire.

Dear Mr. Strang,

I have just received quotation of \$445.20 for lumber, which quotation I asked for in connection with two buildings I wish to erect: one in connection with the school and school farm, with curing place for pork. We have now come to that stage where we raise a great number of hogs and I would like if at all possible, a place where I can cure this pork; bacon prices are much higher and we could with very little expense realise a much greater income.

I wish also to erect a feed shed for Lot 47, with the intention of adding a silo in which to store corn silage for feed purposes there. The pasturage does not cost the school anything and as we have a great deal of roughage for feed in the first crop of hay, we could, by adding silage to the rations, increase our range herd considerably, and also put out for sale the whole of our second crop of hay.

As lumber is fairly low in price at the present time I have added a couple of thousand feet of shiplap, and also some 2" lumber for repairing the flume, which repairing is always necessary in the Spring time.

I have already got out the frame for the proposed building at Lot 47 and the erection of same would be no outside expense other than the lumber.

I would be very glad indeed if the Department could see fit to grant us \$500 for this work.






