

Memorandum.

Mr. Wardle.

I have to refer to Mr. Mills' memorandum of December 20th reporting the work done in connection with the sewage disposal system at the Cecilia Jeffrey Indian Residential School, Kenora Indian Agency, Ontario. We appreciate the promptness with which this matter received attention.

It is noted that the tank had not been cleaned out since its construction many years ago. The Indian Agent has been instructed to advise the school authorities that it is expected that the school staff in future will see that this important duty will be attended to regularly.

This Branch has received a call from Mr. Hugh B. McKinnon, M.P., in connection with the employment aspect of this work. Mr. McKinnon states that he is informed that the workmen were paid off at .35 an hour whereas the rate established by the Department of Labour for the locality is .40 an hour. He was told that this question was under your jurisdiction, but for my information I shall be obliged if you will advise me in connection therewith, as I understand we are likely to have further representations on the subject.

Dear Mr. Dickson:-

Recently certain work was performed for this Branch in connection with the septic tank at the Cecilia Jeffrey Indian Residential School in the vicinity of Kenora. The Indian Agent paid off the workmen at the rate of thirty-five cents per hour, acting, according to his report, on advice received from the Superintendent of the Government Employment Office, presumably an official of the Province of Ontario.

A protest has been received from Mr. H.B. McKinnon, M.P., against this rate as being lower than that set by your department for the district, which I understand is forty cents per hour.

I shall be obliged if you will advise me officially if the higher rate is correct, as in that event an adjustment on behalf of the workmen concerned would appear to be in order.

Superintendent Ritchie informed me that he considered .35¢ would be the correct wage to pay on Dominion Government work.

Inspector Hamilton, who made the arrangements about the work, discussed the matter with my Office and informed me that he considered .35¢ an hour a satisfactory wage. A copy of Mr. Hamilton's letter is enclosed.

When the work was completed, one of the men complained to me that he thought he should have received .40¢ an hour. I wrote to Inspector Hamilton and he replied that he would not agree to our paying .40¢ an hour, as it was understood at the time the men were engaged that they would receive the minimum wage of .35¢ per hour.
