

The attached account from Patmore
Bros. to installation of new Heating Coils, Domestic
Hot Water supply at the Residential School.

When these coils first burnt out it
was impossible to shut the control valves to coil or
to hot water tank. The coil was only replaced last
week due to extreme cold weather prevailing and
uncertainty of sufficient heat while the boiler in
question was down. On examination the control valves
were found to be beyond repair and two new 2 inch
Brass Gate-control valves were installed in this
emergency.

I trust you can concur with the
action taken in this regard and recommend that this
account be paid in full.


MEMORANDUM


