

With reference to the Manual Training Room that has been proposed to be constructed at this ^{new} school. The contractors have submitted to me and to Mr Lett, his estimate of cost of constructing same.

This information was sent to you by wire, yesterday.

I am following up with this letter giving fuller details. I am sending to you (herewith attached) a sketch which shows practically the whole thing. It is built over and on same foundation as boat house addition and same standard of construction maintained, except that the interior face of brickwork will have stacked joints instead of being plastered. 2 Steam heat radiators provided.


Contractor's estimate was \$1400⁰⁰ & will be forwarded to you in writing in a few days

RE: St. George's Indian Residential School,
Lytton, B. C.

I beg to advise you that the general contractors for the above school, Messrs. Adkinson & Dill, have given me the contract for the electrical installation, and in this connection I am sending you, under separate cover, a set of plans showing the wiring installation, which has been approved by the Assistant Provincial Inspector of Electrical Energy, and which I propose to install.

The Local and Provincial By-laws call for dead front cabinets, with the capacity of the mains and feeds based on 10 amperes per circuit. With your approval I intend following their requirements throughout.

May I inquire if any provision has been made for fire gongs? If this is not already taken care of under a separate contract, I should be very glad to quote you, through the general contractors, on a system suitable to this class of building, and acceptable to the local by-laws.

I have your letter of the 23rd instant, and also plans for the electric wiring layout and the general arrangement appears satisfactory. With reference to the last paragraph of your letter regarding the placing of fire gongs in the building, I would ask you to kindly submit a price to Mr. Batter, the Inspector of Construction, for the providing and installing of a suitable fire gong on each floor of the building. It has been the practice in the past to have these fire gongs controlled from one of the staff rooms on each floor. I am advising Mr. Batter, the Inspector, that I have asked you to give him this price. Please furnish the Inspector with a copy of the layout of the wiring.

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

The improvements asked for are most necessary in order to centralize the work of school and farm, and as the old ones at the present school will be far too unhandy and the cellars are getting far too old to last very much longer, it will have to be done very soon anyway. Also the horse barn will be required to be built nearer the work.

Trusting the Department will see its way clear to make these improvements in order to centralization everything by the time the new school is opened,

This centralization calls for a new Horse Barn. This should be built on the same plan as the Cow Barn & adjoining same with a driveway in between. For the time being this is the most needed & I would be glad if the Dept. could take immediate steps to erect same.

Root Cellars, Apple cellars, Machine & handyp man shops together with blacksmiths shop are also needed & would be glad also if these

The Reverend Principal of the Lytton Indian Residential School urges the early provision of a horse barn, root cellars and general work shop as soon as possible. He represents that the horse barn should be attended to without delay. The Vote for the Lytton buildings included the cost of a horse barn, and Mr. Orr and I wish to recommend that Mr. Lett be asked to make a sketch of the barn he requires and indicate if he would be willing to undertake the work on a day labour basis. I believe he will agree to this proposal and I should be grateful if you would approve of the scheme. When the estimate of the cost is received, the letter of authority will be prepared for your signature.

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

The building of the root cellar and utility shop will have to be left until some future date. With reference to the barn, I would ask you to please consult with Mr. Lett and advise me if he is prepared to undertake the erection of this building by day labour. If so kindly submit to the Department a sketch showing the size and type of building required, with an estimate of the cost. As soon as this information is received definite instructions will be sent you.
