With reference to your letter of the 12th instant, the Department will allow an amount of \$40.00 a month for the period November 1, 1945, to April 30, 1946, towards the salary of a night watchman at the Kootenay Indian Residential School. We are preparing a voucher here for the amount due the school for the period November 1, 1945, to February 28, 1946. You should instruct the Indian Agent for the Kootenay Agency to forward a voucher at the end of March and a final one at the end of April. Each of these vouchers should read as follows:

AGENT'S REPORT FOR THE QUARTER ENDING DECEMBER 31st, 1945.

Welfare and Training:

The Kootenay Indian School under the efficient leadership of Reverend Gerald Kelly, O.M.I., has made very steady progress during this quarter. The pupils are making rapid progress in their class room studies, domestic science, and manual training. The tubercular patients have shown very satisfactory improvements. There has been little or no sickness in school during this quarter except for five cases of measles, one reported on December 17th and four on December 29th. Antimeasles serum was used on the contacts and it is hoped that this epidemic will reach no great proportions. The pupils are well nourished and their health is carefully looked after by Sister Marion Clare. The pupils were vaccinated against small pox, and will be vaccinated against typhoid as soon as the measles is over. The school is well supplied with milk, eggs, vegetables and fruit.

This school carries eight pupils in excess of its quota. Three Auld children, who do not belong to the reserves, will be returned home as soon as the quarantine on measles permits, however, this still leaves us short of space for twelve pupils from the Columbia lake and Shuswap Reserves who should be returned to school, not only for their own good but as a matter of discipline. This matter has been referred to the Department and I am awaiting a reply before taking any action.

The fire extinguishers requisitioned for the school were finally received, and fire drills are held as per regulations. One unscheduled rehearsal was held at 5:00 o'clock one morning when the new fireman and night watchman inadvertently pulled the fire alarm. This proved to be a good and successful fire drill. In addition to the night watchman and fireman, Rev. Father Kelly has hired a new farm manager, who has good recommendations.

On my last inspection it was noted that good work had been done in redecorating the girls play room, several chairs having successfully been re-upholstered with bright materials. Kindergarten tables and temporary chairs as well as other objects have been fashioned in the Manual Training department. The domestic science department does excellent work in cooking under the direction of Sister John Anthony and Sister Catherine Mary's sewing class produced very good work. The pantry and hallway near the father's dining room has also been redecorated.

The situation with reference to the plumbing at the school is still bad, even though some of the toilets were temporarily repaired, flush actions, etc. are so far unobtainable. One urinal near the boys dormitory was put in working order and all taps were replaced.

The situation with regard to power is worse, the Lister engine has not been in operation since it was repaired, having run only for two weeks; the Petters engine, which is used to pump water, recently broke down, the fuel jets being gone. It is now undergoing emergency repairs. This leaves us entirely dependent on the old Otto engine which through Father Kelly's ingenuity was "rigged up" to pump water. This engine consumes gasoline at the rate of nearly a gallon an hour! So that between pumping water and charging batteries which will not hold their charge, it is pounding away from morn till dark. The Petters engine should be repaired in two or three days but the present situation emphasizes the gravity of the situation with reference to the electric generating plant at this school. At my request, Mr. John Ward of the Modern Electric recently submitted a report on this situation and copies of it were forwarded to the Commissioner's office. The water pump has recently caused quite a bit of anxiety, it was leaking so badly that it had to be primed before each pumping. It is a very ancient and heavy contraption and it is feared that the base is so corroded that it may give out altogether for the time being it has been packed with oakum, but it may become necessary to call in a welder to weld on a new base.

As a result of Commissioner MacKay's visit, authority was granted to install a new sink unit near the childrens dining room. This will prove to be more sanitary and a great improvement for which we feel very grateful.

Rev. Father Kelly has given sporting activities more meaning in this school and he has recently purchased skated and toboggans which the children are enjoying.





School. It will be noticed that your Purchase Order
No. 5838 was for a net cost of \$431.20, arrived at by
discounting the gross cost of \$805.00 - 20% and 20%
less allowance on old cells \$84.00.

The Globelite Company on the other hand
has deducted the allowance on the used cells from the
gross price and allowed the 20% and 20% discount on
the balance, which leaves a disparity of \$30.24 in
their favour.

Because of the short time until the close
of the fiscal year, I am submitting Voucher No. 397
in accordance with their figures and would request that
you tax and amend the voucher if you see fit, advising
me of any amendment.
