DESCRIPTION OF BATTERIES

WILLARD TYPE PH BATTERIES have been designed especially for Lighting Plant work. All of the material entering into their construction must pass rigid mechanical and chemical tests, while our close inspection and large production enables us to maintain uniformity of product.

In their design and manufacture is embodied the experience gained from twenty years of successful battery building.

The PH Batteries are of the sealed glass jar type, using plates which are exceptionally heavy to give a long life. The elements are suspended from the cover, leaving a clear sediment space in the bottom of the jar. The battery will not have to be cleaned during the life of the plates. The connection between cells is made by a flexible strip of rolled lead made integral with the positive connecting strap and bolted to the negative terminal of the adjacent cell. This construction reduces the number of bolted connections to a minimum and insures against connecting the cells in a wrong manner.



Dear Sir:-

In reply to official letter No. 155001-5 dated October 16th. re. fire insurance etc. permit me to say.

1. There is no question whatever as to liability of British American Co. for \$7.50, one half expense of repairing damage done by fire on the night of July 11th/22.
2. All needed repairs to tower struck by lightning Sept. 5th. have been made by Ponsford Construction Co. Need I point out that the responsibility for paying this Company rests with the Insurance people, and not with the Department.
3. In the item of \$15.00 for July repairs, the school acted on instructions from Mr. Tweman of Strathroy for the Insurance Co. and to him we must look for our pay. If he paid it to the Dept. you should forward to us as we paid it out, otherwise we shall ask payment from him.





For failure to file returns on or before 30th April:

- (a) 25% of the amount of the tax.
- (b) \$100 per day in case of persons who fail to file
returns after formal demand.

For making false returns:

- (a) Upon summary conviction a fine not exceeding \$10,000
or six months imprisonment or both fine and
imprisonment.
