Dear Sir

Your official letter to Principal
Indian Agents, Church and Department Officials
received. And as we find that the same
applies to our present circumstances and
requirements, I am writing through our
Agent regarding our needs.

For some years we have experienced very
trying times, poor crops, high prices, and
other things which very seriously affected our
work in the school.

We realize that when times were hard
for us in our school they were hard for
all, and we tried to do with what we
had.

Now we have come to the place where
we must add to and renew in several
particulars.

I. We must renew the sash in sixteen
windows.

II. We need twelve seats in the school
rooms.

III. We need twenty four new springs
for single iron beds, and
six new beds.

Having been instructed by Mr. McHalt our Indian Agent to obtain an estimate of the cost of required bed springs, and new sash for windows. I am setting down in this letter the best possible prices we could obtain.

The J. E. Simpson Co Limited, will give us a good strong, (Extra strong) spring for beds at \$3.85 each. This being almost the actual cost to them. They would make them special for our purpose. 25 Bed springs @ \$3.85 = \$95.25

The best possible price for Window Sash - glazed and primed ready to fit is \$4.50
16 Pair Window Sash @ \$4.50 = \$72.00
strips for window stops. 3.00
\$75.00

Referring to the seating required, we would very much like to remove from the Senior class room the number of seats required by the pupils in the Junior class-room, and in this case to ask the Department to allow us to have individual seating in the Senior class-room. Our present seating is the double folding seats, but we believe much better results can be obtained from the single seats especially in the Senior room.

At the request of the Department favouring the school with the request for new seats in the senior room. We would still ask that the number be changed from seats for twenty four, (12 school desks), to seats of desks for thirty pupils.

In our present arrangement we have had to substitute chairs and small tables for most of the pupils in the Senior Class room, our junior room being larger and pupils more numerous in that room.

Fully realizing the present condition of financial matters, and considering to some degree the extent of the expenditure the Department are being subjected to at this time we shall be ever thankful.

Sir:-

I have received your letter of the 13th instant, enclosing the Rev. Principal's report on certain immediate needs at the Shingwauk Home. I have noted that 25 bed springs will cost \$95.25 and that new window sash will mean an expenditure of \$170.25. I have also noted that the Rev. Principal would be pleased to have 30 school desks for the senior classroom and that the desks now in use for the older pupils can be placed in the junior room.

In reply I beg to state that the Department will authorize you to purchase 16 pair of window sash and to engage the necessary skilled labour. Competitive prices should be secured and the work performed at as reasonable a price as possible. Accounts should be in duplicate, properly certified by you, and can be submitted to the Department for payment.

I am pleased to inform you that the Department will also provide 30 school desks for the senior classroom. These will be ordered from Ottawa and shipped to the Rev. Principal.

The Department is of the opinion that the expenditure necessary for 25 bed springs should be met from the per capita grant.

Rev. Sir: -

Mr. Agent McNabb has forwarded your request to be supplied with 30 single desks for the use of the Shingwauk Home. The Department is informing him that we will provide seating accommodation for 30 pupils in the senior classroom and that the order will be placed here and the desks shipped to you.

However, before placing the order it will be necessary to have further particulars. You should state the proposed arrangement of these desks in the classroom, that is, the number of rows, in order that the proper number of front and rear seats can be ordered. In arranging the desks the smaller sizes are usually placed at the front and the larger to the rear. By supplying front and rear seats with the desks, there is no waste in the seating. I enclose herewith a catalogue and by reference to Page 5 thereof you will see the table of sizes. You should state from this catalogue the sizes or number of the desks required and the number of each size. If a sketch of the proposed seating arrangement is forwarded it will assist us in placing the order.

Kindly give the above information as soon as possible when, in compliance with the requirements of the Purchasing Commission of Canada, competitive prices for the supplying of the number of desks required will be obtained from the manufacturers of school desks.

the room.

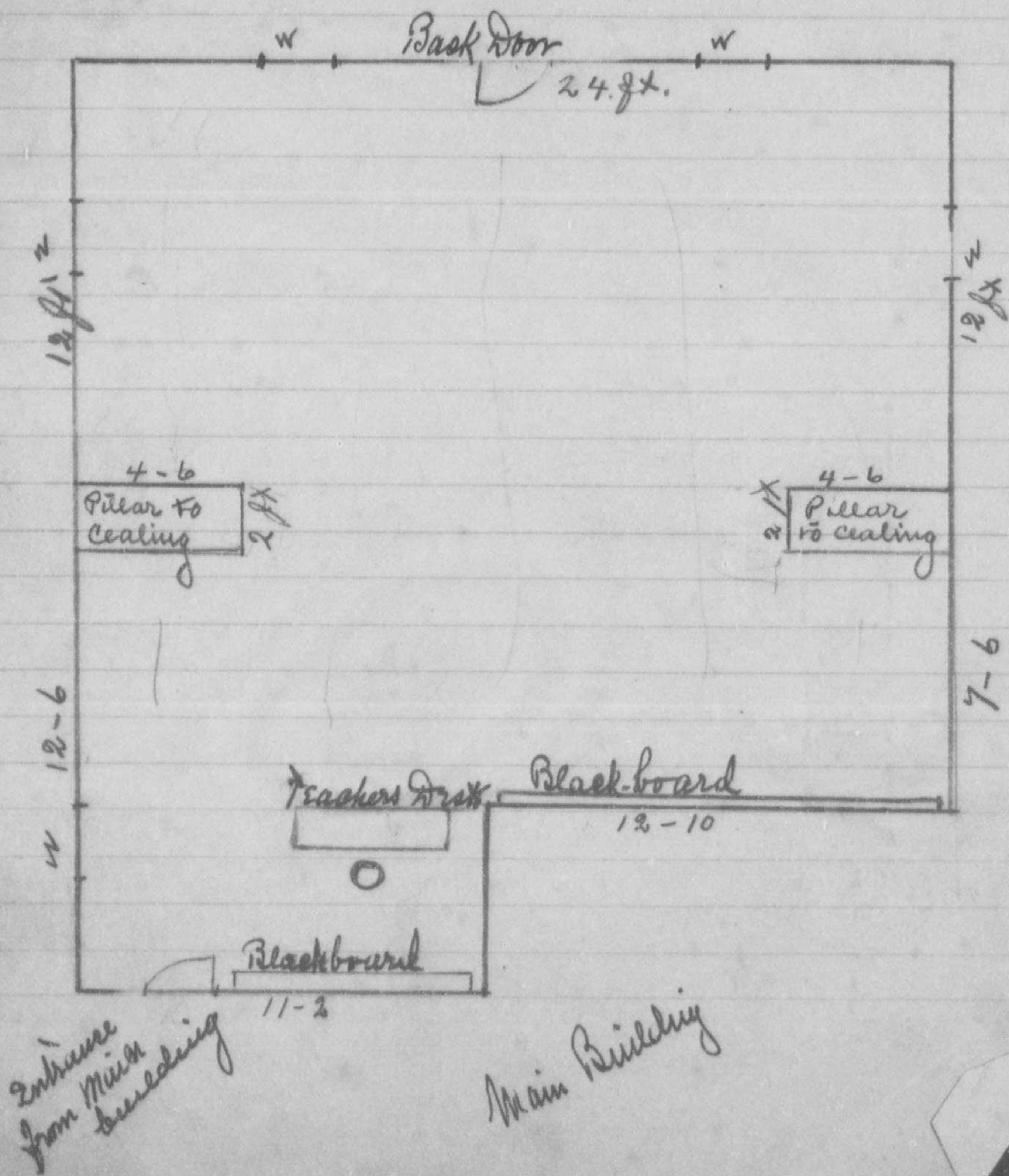
There are some seats in the

I have to acknowledge receipt of your letter of the 24th instant, enclosing a communication from the Principal of the Shingwauk Home regarding the desks required, also enclosing a sketch giving the dimensions of the classroom.

In reply I beg to say that we are calling for prices for the supplying of the following quantity of desks, viz:-

14	Single Steel Desks for pupils	15 - 18 years,
14	" " " " " "	12 - 15 "
4	Fronts	" " 12 - 15 "
4	Rears	" " 15 - 18 "

This will provide seating accommodation for 36 children. It is thought that they can be arranged in four rows of seven desks each, together with a front and rear seat. It is difficult, owing to the pillars which extend on each side of the classroom, to arrange a definite seating plan; but, when the desks arrive, the principal should arrange to have them set up to the best possible advantage. We will inform you later as to the name of the firm receiving the order.

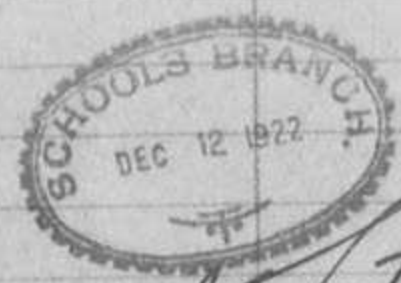
