tember 9^d, wearing Institution clothing.
Expenses to be charged if he does not return
\$9.00

3. Pascoe Hill age 4 (son of
Harriet Hill) His mother signed for
him to remain five years. Entered August
10^d. Enticed away by his mother Sep-
tember 9^d, wearing Institution clothing.
Expenses to be charged, if he does not
return, \$8.00.

You will please use your
utmost endeavors to get these boys
returned, which will save further
trouble

trouble in collecting from the parent
 the amounts claimed by the Institution
 in case the boys do not return. But
 more especially would the Depart-
 ment wish that the boy named
 Parson Hill should be induced to
 return, as the relatives of his late
 father, some very respectable people
 in England, have guaranteed the
 entire cost of his living and training for
 5 years, and are deeply concerned
 for the boys welfare, and wish
 every effort to be made to effect his
 return to the Institution. You
 will please do all you can to
 this end.
