The Committee of the Privy Council have had before
them a report dated 13th November, 1947, from the Acting Minister
of Mines and Resources, stating:

That under Vote 181 of the 1947-48 estimates of the
Department of Mines and Resources, funds have been provided
for repairs and replacements to the domestic hot and cold
water system now installed in the Indian Residential School,
at Shubenacadie, N.S.;

That tenders were invited, on the basis of drawings and
specifications prepared by the Department, by an engineer of
the Engineering and Construction Service of the Department;

That bona-fide lump sum tenders were received from the
parties and for amounts as follows:-

W.J. Christie, Esq., Truro, N.S.	\$7,250.00
Roscoe Schofield, Esq., White Rock, N.S.	8,007.00
Edwin H. Campbell, Esq., Truro, N.S.	8,132.59
J.A. Moulton, Esq., 13 Clifton, St., Halifax, N.S.	8,900.00
J.D. Barrett, Esq., Truro, N.S.	10,546.46

That the tenders were analyzed and found to be in
accordance with the drawings, specifications and tendering
documents prepared by the Department;

That with provision for contingencies and supervision
the acceptance of the lowest tender would entail an approximate
total expenditure of \$8,000.

Accepted
As the work is considered to be of an emergency
character, the Minister recommends that he be authorized to
accept the lowest tender, as submitted by W.J. Christie, Esq.,
Plumbing and Heating Contractor of Truro, N.S., and to enter
into a contract with him for the repairs and replacements
required, in accordance with drawings and specifications pre-
pared by the Department, and the Contractor's tender of \$7,250
which, with provision for contingencies and supervision will
entail a total expenditure of funds to the approximate amount
of \$8,000, the said expenditure to be met from the appropriate
Votes of the Indian Affairs Branch, Department of Mines and
Resources.

The Committee concur in the foregoing recommendation
and submit the same for approval.





You recently forwarded to this office a copy of your memorandum of December 4th to Mr. Mills with reference to P.C. 4844 dated November 26th, 1947, authorizing acceptance of the tender of W.J. Christie for \$7,250. for repairs and replacements at the above school.

Mr. Morris, Acting Inspector of Indian Agencies, has just returned from Nova Scotia and he was informed recently that the contractor is having difficulty in obtaining the materials he requires to carry out the work and consequently does not expect to start until some time in March. We are extremely anxious to have the work at the Shubenacadie Residential School completed at the earliest possible date, not only because the repairs are urgently required but the funds for the work are included in the current year's appropriation.

We would appreciate it very much if your Branch could give some assistance to the contractor in securing materials so that the necessary work may be completed before the end of March, 1948.

Memorandum

Re: Indian Residential School,
Shubenacadie, Nova Scotia.

With reference to your notation dated the 23rd ultimo on the memorandum dated December 19th from Col. Neary of the Indian Affairs Branch relative to the above, it was assumed that a telephone conversation between Mr. Sinclair and our Mr. Buck covered the points raised.

Confirming what was said at that time, you are advised that there are no restrictions in effect on any materials the contractor is obligated to use in his work on the contract, and this Division can be of no assistance in expediting delivery of materials in short supply, for execution of a lump sum contract.

Our engineer who dealt with the matter when the contract was awarded contacted Christie before his return to Ottawa from Nova Scotia. From his analysis of the contractor's remarks Mr. Ross formed the opinion that the material situation has improved, and that no serious delay in obtaining materials is likely to occur.

For your information. It would appear that the contractor is now having more success in the way of securing the required materials. You will appreciate that in cases like this when priorities are off that it is pretty well up to the contractor to look after the securing of supplies. *J. Miller* Chief Engineer.






