Dear Sir,

The Department has observed that tooth brushes have been forwarded for use in the schools in your Agency, and by way of encouraging the children to take proper care of their teeth, a small supply of camphorated chalk for each school is being forwarded in your care. A carton and the proper number of small boxes should be given each school at the commencement of the next term. Each child should have a small supply of chalk in a box with his or her name on the outside. A large supply is not necessary.

Another matter I would like to mention is the daily routine of children transferred from Sanatoria to Shubenacadie. Should these children not have a rest period in the afternoons and not be subjected to strenuous labor? Esther Phillips has returned from the school. Her family (at Woodstock) are always in great trouble you will remember, so allowances should be made. Her mother complained that Esther had to work hard all the time, did not have any rest period during the day but at play time had to go out and romp instead of resting and that she was punished by having to stand at night for several hours - of course this may all be greatly exaggerated.
