




Dear Sir,-



Sir.—

In reply to Dept. letter 108-2-5, of Feb. 27th, re building of a cold storage at Cowessess Boarding School, I beg to state that Mr. Nestman, the successful tenderer is now residing at the Pacific coast.

It would be impossible to have this building completed by the first of April in any case, owing to the danger from frost. The painting would have to be done in fine weather as well as the cement work. No contractor would guarantee the work if undertaken before the 15th of April.

The material could be placed on the ground before the first of April, however, and Mr. Nestman's representative at Grayson would see to this at once. Kindly advise me by wire as to the decision of the Department, in order that the material may be moved while the roads are yet good for sleighing.
