
Sir: Departmental letter No. 155-0-5, May 9, 1932.

I beg to report that I have gone carefully into the matter of the purchase of materials and the painting of the exterior of Kootenay Indian Residential School, as directed in the above Departmental letter, and, acting on the advice of Mr. F. H. Dezall, quotations have been obtained from Mr. Jas. Norgrove, Cranbrook, which I beg to enclose herewith, offering to supply all materials and do the work of painting the exterior of the school for the sum of \$475.00. Mr. Dezall also advised that the paint be purchased from Mr. Norgrove.

I beg to submit that the estimate supplied by Mr. Norgrove about a year ago to do this work was for \$450. and this, he states, was for the materials only, but after making a careful examination of the school building, Mr. Norgrove stated that it would be too dangerous to use any other than skilled labour in doing the work. The greater part of the work must be done from swinging platforms at a distance of about forty feet from the ground, and although the total cost of painting the exterior and supplying paint for the interior will be about \$550.00, \$100.00 more than was anticipated, I would respectfully recommend that it be done as suggested by Mr. Norgrove. This, I beg to submit, meets with the approval of both the Reverend Principal and Mr. Dezall.

Dear Sir:

I have secured from the Cranbrook Sash and Door Co. Ltd, an estimate covering the cost of a permanent poultry house suitable for our school. The estimated cost is \$250.00 for a building 16' x 32' substantially constructed with cement flooring. This is for material only, the work to be done by our school employees with the assistance of the older boys.

This building is a great necessity for our school. We have a very good flock of laying birds but very poor winter accommodation for them. Such a building would provide us with eggs all winter for staff and children, which would add greatly to the health of our children.

As the Indian Department has already been asked to grant this request, I feel sure that it will meet with favorable consideration. I will be glad if you will make this recommendation for me.

Sir:

I have your letter of the 6th instant, enclosing communications which you received from the Principal of the Kootenay Indian Residential School, in which he requests to be supplied with a small generator for use at the schools and with materials with which to construct a poultry house.

In this connection I have to refer you to official letter of May 5th, last, informing you that approximately \$1100 would be available for improvements at this school this year. Authority has already been granted for the painting of the exterior of the school building, at a price of \$475, leaving a balance of \$625 for further improvements.

It is noted that, after discussing the matter of repairs with the Rev. Principal, the generator and materials for a poultry house are most urgently required. The Department will approve of your arranging for the purchase of a small generator, to be attached to the Diesel oil pumping engine for lighting purposes, at a cost of approximately \$225, and for the purchase of the lumber and other material required in the erection of the poultry house, at a cost of \$250. The purchase of the above equipment should be from a firm on the list to receive consideration. The Department notes that the labour in the construction of the poultry house will be performed by the school employees, with the assistance of the older boys. You should obtain an account, in triplicate, covering the cost of the generator, and itemized accounts, in triplicate, covering the cost of lumber and other materials for the poultry house. These, you should attach to proper voucher forms, certify in the usual manner and forward to the Department for payment.

Dear Sir:

The matter that I am bringing to your attention is a very distasteful one and is in connection with a long outstanding account incurred by the Rev. Father Patterson of the Kootenay Indian Residential School at Cranbrook, for merchandise that this firm has supplied to him for the pupils of this school. The account is not a personal one, and I am enclosing a copy of our statement to give you an idea how long this matter has been outstanding, and I can assure you, sir, that I can ill afford to wait this great length of time for monies which are due to this firm. I have written letters crouched in the friendliest of terms, I have rendered statements for many months, I have registered letters to him in connection with this account but have had no reply. Some three weeks ago in despair I went up to see one of the officials of the Indian Dept. here in Calgary who strongly advised me to write to the Oblate Fathers in Edmonton, and in their reply they mentioned that no Catholic Indian Mission in B.C. came under their jurisdiction and they advised me to write to the Provincial Bursar, St. Patricks College, Ottawa, which I did and have received a reply very similar to the Oblate Fathers at Edmonton that this is outside their jurisdiction. Surely, sir, something can be done about this matter, and I would earnestly ask you to use your efforts in this seemingly distasteful matter and plead with you now that you assist me to get my account cleaned up.



Dear Sir:-

Further to my letter of May 25th in which I quoted the sum of \$652.00 for materials and labor to cover two coats of paint on all outside woodwork, etc., and cleaning the metal roof on the north side of Kootenay Indian Residential School, I may say that one coat of creosote stain on the eaves of the building would last almost as long as two coats of paint on the more exposed parts, and this would reduce the estimated cost by \$127.00. I also included in the estimate the cost of cleaning the north side of the metal roof, which certainly should be done, and if this is left until another year it would further reduce the estimate by \$50.00.

I would therefore undertake to supply all necessary materials and do the work as outlined in my letter of May 25th, using one coat of creosote stain instead of two and leaving out the cleaning of the roof, for the sum of \$475.00.




