Dear Mr. Marison,-

I am sending you today, under separate cover, two sets of blue prints of a rough sketch which I have prepared of the proposed new Qu'Appelle School. I would ask you to kindly consult with the Reverend Principal as to the layout as shown on the plan and return one copy to me with any comments or suggestions.

Of course you understand that at present there is no assurance that the building will be erected next year, or that funds will be provided for even a commencement, but as it takes some time to complete the plans for the building, I thought it advisable to have them ready in case funds are provided. Kindly make this point clear to the Principal.

When returning the plans I would like whatever information you can give me on the following items which affect the construction,-

1. The existing water supply.
2. The fuel used in the boilers.
3. Existing septic tank and drainage.
4. Electric power available, and whether 110 volt or 220 volt.
5. Nature of soil for the footings.
6. If possible a rough sketch showing the location of the old buildings and where it is proposed to locate the new school with reference to the buildings destroyed.

I will be glad to have this information and the plans returned at your earliest convenience. Any suggestions you wish to make with reference to the construction of the new school I will be glad to receive, and they will be given consideration.



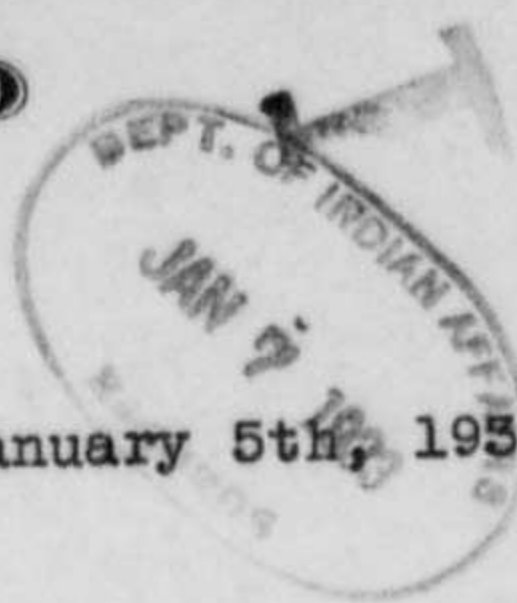

The rebuilding of this School is of course a necessity of the first order. The children, as the Department knows, are now housed in the Seminary of the Oblate Fathers and in the Town Hall. School accommodation is provided in the old Parish Church of Lebret. It is hardly possible to describe the hardships experienced by the Principal and the staff in the conduct of a school as large as that of Lebret under such trying circumstances.

The Department last December agreed to build a temporary structure on the foundations of the old administration building, but the Principal preferred to keep whatever money would have been spent in this connection for the new buildings.

It is hoped that the Department will be able to make a very early start in the reconstruction of the Lebret School this coming spring.

The Oblate Fathers of St. Boniface have ten schools under their jurisdiction. In view of the fact that Lebret School was destroyed by fire they have limited their demands for these schools to such repairs and improvements as they thought absolutely necessary so that the Department would have more funds for the rebuilding of the Lebret School.
