

Dear Mr Hoey,-

May I again respectfully submit for your consideration a request for a Tractor and row crop drill and cultivator. All the implement firms are turning out the ideal outfits for our work here. At all our schools the most important part of our crop is the row crop. Potatoes, Field and tabecorn, turnips, carrots, parsnips. Sugar beets, mangels and peas. This involves a tremendous amount of hoeing and if we do not have the proper equipment it is a never ending task. The heaviest and most important part comes while the children are on holidays.

I have reported the condition of the tractor that we have here, and I will now give you an extract of a letter to the Department written by my predecessor Rev, W.R. Wood in June 1935.

"In the matter of farm equipment there is a tractor, - a very ancient Rumely Oil-Pull which is still conscripted each Fall and made to furnish power for the threshing. It has, I believe, been used for anything else for some time. The Oil-pull is out of date and requires constant tinkering, and in my judgement should be replaced by an up to date tractor which could be used not only for threshing but for ploughing and other field work and for running a grain crusher."

During the past ~~three~~ four years I have spent a lot of money for repairs and oil to keep this worn out tractor running, it cannot be used for field work. May I therefore ask for a grant for tractor and attachments: row crop drill and cultivator. The cost for tractor, drill and cultivator will be about \$1,500.00

There is no Manure Spreader on the farm and this next Summer we shall have over 200 tons of manure to spread on the fields, the cost of Spreader will be about \$200.00

May I ask for your best consideration of this urgent need.

Dear Mr. Jones:

I have for acknowledgment your letter of the 12th instant, in which you send forward, for departmental consideration, a request for a tractor and row crop drill and cultivator, for use at your school farm.

I must state frankly that there is not even a remote possibility of securing this equipment at any time in the immediate future. Owing to the limited funds at our disposal, we are at this date unable to pay in full the per capita grants to our Indian residential schools and yesterday we notified Dr. Cochrane to this effect. Just what action will be taken in the immediate future to reduce costs at Indian residential schools, I am not in a position to state, but I do feel confident that it will be impossible to secure the money necessary for the purchase of farm equipment. If the time at my disposal will enable me to do so, it is my intention to visit Toronto in the course of a week or so and carefully review the whole matter with the church authorities.



Dear Sir:

I am advised by Rev. Jones, Principal of the Portage la Prairie Residential School, that he required the following poultry wire immediately:

- 5 rolls of "Layflat Poultry Netting" 72 inches
- 5 rolls of " " " 24 inches
- 10 lbs. of wire fence staples
- 10 lbs. of soft galv. wire for lacing above rolls

I understand this has been ordered from Marshall-Wells Company, and will cost approximately \$94.50.

Mr. Jones is the one principal making a success of chickens. He has about 450 hens. The children help care for them, and there are no locks on the doors. Apparently the boys like the work and can be trusted. I believe this is a worth while work. The fence is required to enlarge feeding grounds and is a permanent improvement. Would the Department allow me to forward a voucher in payment of the wire?

Mr. Jones explained the necessity of purchasing certain farming equipment and consequently is finding it difficult to finance. If funds can be made available I would recommend payment of this account.

Dear Sir:

I am in receipt of your letter of the 29th ultimo with reference to an expenditure of \$94.50 incurred by the Principal of the Portage la Prairie Residential School for the purchase of poultry wire.

In the current year's appropriation it was found necessary to provide an amount of \$2000.00 for necessary improvements to the sewage system at this school. Under these circumstances no other amount was included for repairs and improvements. Besides, the Principal of the Portage la Prairie Residential School should realize that owing to the present purchase regulations he should have submitted a request before making any purchase.

However, in view of your recommendation we will endeavour to have the account approved by the Purchasing Branch and, if so, it will be paid. You may, therefore, submit the voucher for our consideration. It should be definitely understood with the Principal of the Portage la Prairie School that no further expenditure this year can be considered.

1. With reference to the above and further to P.C.M. dated 16-4-41 in this connection, I have to report that the Complainant Joseph JONES informed this office that he had heard a rumour (the source of which could not be ascertained) to the effect that Jim DANIELS, a probable suspect had sold a set of harness to Pete MARRIN, Long Plains Indian Reserve, for \$1.50 some few days ago.

2. I patrolled per P.C. 8085 to the Long Plains Indian Reserve accompanied by Sgt. Andrews, where Pete MARRIN was interviewed. He stated that he had purchased a set of old harness from Ed. PACHIAS, a halfbreed of Portage, on the 8-4-41. He produced this old set of harness, which in no way resembled the set lost by the complainant and further stated that this old harness had been stored in the farm instructors barn for a couple of years. PACHIAS had one other set of harness which was also examined but it did not bear the description of the set stolen.

3. Mr. SAWYER, farm instructor of the Long Plain Indian Reserve, was next interviewed and stated that Ed. PACHIAS had had an old set of harness stored in his barn for two or three years, and on the 8-4-41, Pete MARRIN had made a deal to purchase this old harness from Ed PACHIAS for \$1.50 and the deal was made between the two in his presence and MARRIN removed this old set of harness from his barn. It was ascertained through local enquiries that MARRIN had purchased this harness from Ed. PACHIAS and not from DANIELS as reported by the complainant and this purchase was made sometime before the harness referred to was alleged to have been stolen.

4. Mr. SAWYER, farm instructor of the Long Plains Indian Reserve, is going to co-operate with this detachment in making enquiries in the reserve from time to time and should he receive any information of value, this office will be notified. A large number of the Indians in the reserve were interviewed and enquiries made by the patrol, but no further information could be obtained.

5. This matter has been kept in mind by members of the detachment while on patrol in the rural districts and the harness of horses working in the fields have been checked but no harness which resembles that lost by the complainant have been observed. The second hand stores at Portage have been checked periodically but without results. The Portage la Prairie City Police advise that they have nothing further in this matter.



With reference to the above, & further to P.C.R's, submitted in this connection, I have to report that, investigation has been continued, in this matter, but to date no additional information is forthcoming. The complainant has again been interviewed but has no further information to offer. Mr SAWYER, Farm Instructor, at The Long Plains Indian Reserve has made extensive enquiries amongst the Indians on the reserve, but reports that he has been unable to obtain any information of value.

2. Members of this Detachment have examined harness on work horses throughout the Community, when on patrol in the District, but no harness which resembles that lost by complainant has been observed. The second hand Stores in the City have been periodically checked but no trace of the harness referred to can be found. The Portage La Prairie City Police who were notified of this offence report that they have received no information in this connection.

3. Investigation in this connection is being continued & further report will be submitted in due course.


