Enclosed please find copy of letter of Agent Spinney, Kentville, and copy of my reply to him.

The girl in question is Pauline Phillips, No. 0164.

On Sunday, November 1st, this child with no pains or aches was running a temperature of 101-103. The Doctor was called and came every day until the child was taken to the V.G. Hospital on Friday, November 6th. The second or third day here she passed a large worm and the Doctor thought that was the cause of the temperature. But even after that, the temperature continued. From what I heard the hospital authorities declared that she has water on the lung.

I had written Agent Clarence Spinney twice to inform him of the girl's condition. This is the first time I ever heard of the Agent giving instructions to the hospital when the child was admitted to the hospital from the school.






