Dear Major Randle:

Re our telephone conversation the "Dental treatment for the children of the Mohawk Institute."

The few years I have been doing this work it has been my endeavour and practise to give the children the best dental service possible and for the greatest number. To complete dental service for 40 or 50 children in 7 days means some very diligent attention to give this service properly. Most suitable and convenient surroundings must be at hand and that place is my Dental Office.

If it is your intention to ask for the Brantford Schools Dental Clinic outfit, and it is granted you, I may say that it takes one day to pack, move, and set up the equipment when my assistant and I move. That means two days lost for working on the children. I may say that Dental Services are at a premium during the war and since its end, and I know for a fact that some dentists could not arrange an appointment for three months. So it is too much to ask any dentist to complete 7-day service before March 15th. That could have been arranged much earlier.

The Government have also asked the local dentists to give immediate attention to the Dental service for ex-service men. We are trying to co-operate, and personally I have 15 Dental charts for 15 ex-service men and more new ones each day. These must be attended to at once.

To ask the Institution to send five children each week for a half-day for appointments is co-operating, in view of the above circumstances.

I told Mrs. Zimmerman that during Easter Holidays I would give an all-day service until the seven days have been completed.

With reference to Dr. Linscott's letter to you of February 23, I discussed it with Dr. Moore, who stated that he was going to London and would stop off at Brantford. He is away this week and I hope you have an opportunity of meeting him.

I also spoke to him in regard to the situation at the Mohawk Institute in connection with the medical services. I pointed out to him that the school has been paying \$2.00 a day to the doctor for several years. There is no reason why Mohawk Institute should not be treated on the same basis as other residential schools throughout Canada, the services of the doctor being made a charge against the Medical Vote. Dr. Moore promised me that he would also discuss this matter with you.

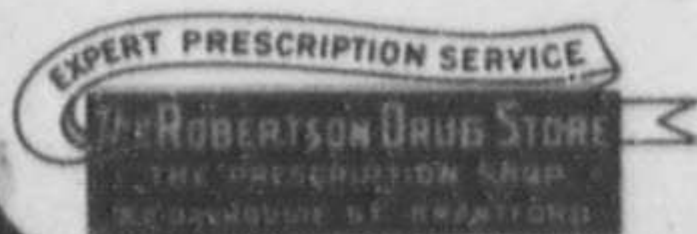

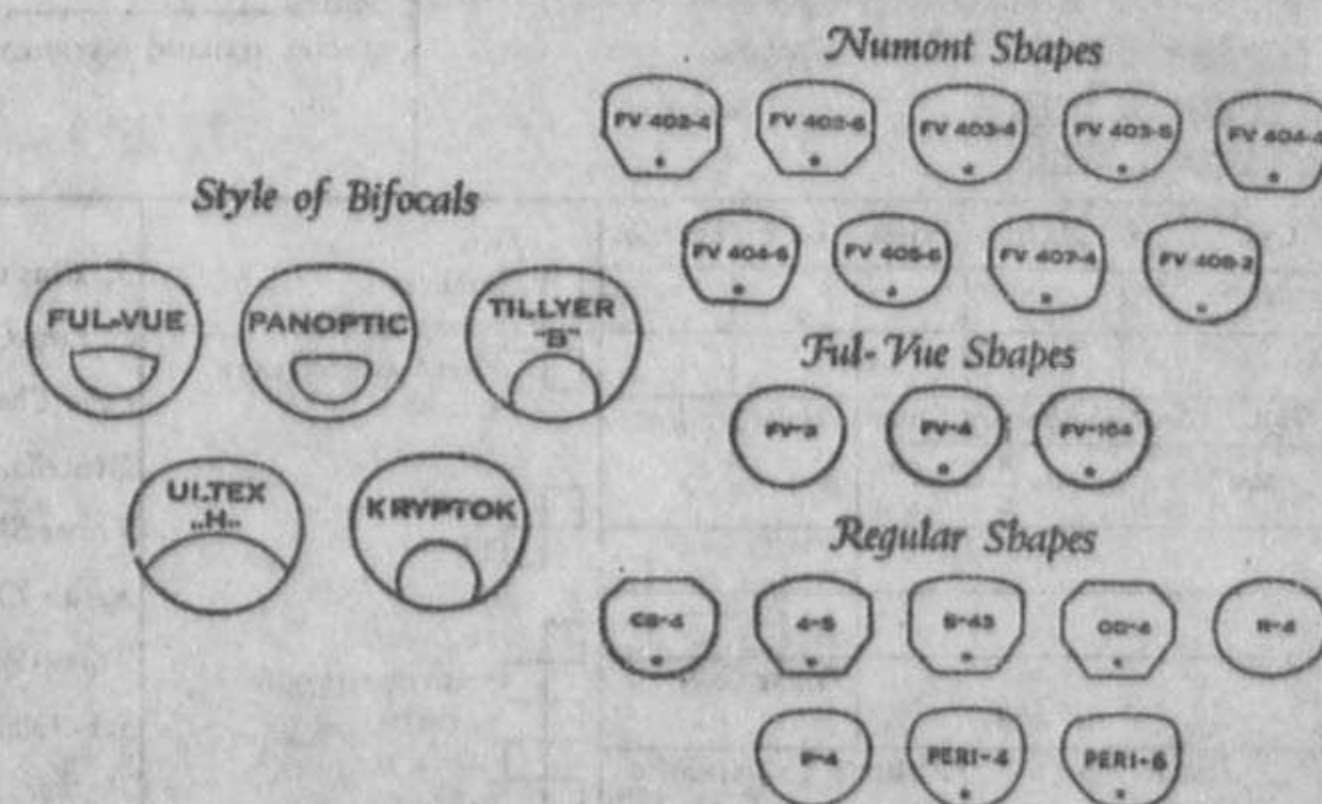

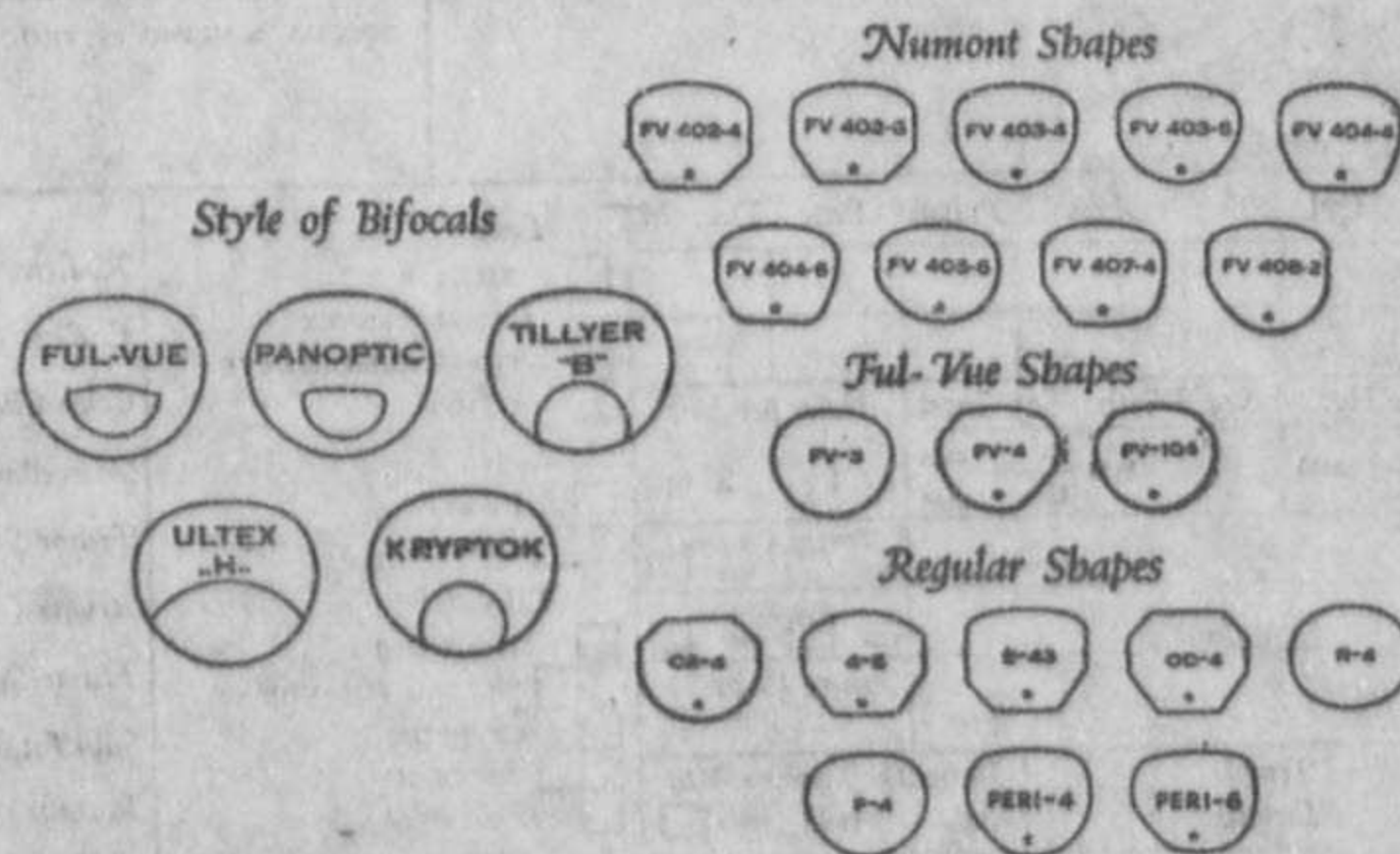

Dear Sir:

During this past week I sent one of the boys to the Lady Willingdon Hospital, Ohsweken. He was 10 years of age. He had a V.D. condition from birth. The test of his sister was neither positive or negative. A further test has to be made. Four more children are to be tested.

I am reporting these facts to you so that if you have any suggestions to make I shall be very happy to carry them out if possible. For example the boys have been using the common towel. This lad who is in the hospital had matter discharging from the eye at one stage. Needless to say that is not a happy condition. We have no locker space for the boys so that I cannot see how we can handle individual towels if they were acceptable. There are quite a number of points that come to my mind as preventive measures.


Reverend Sir,-

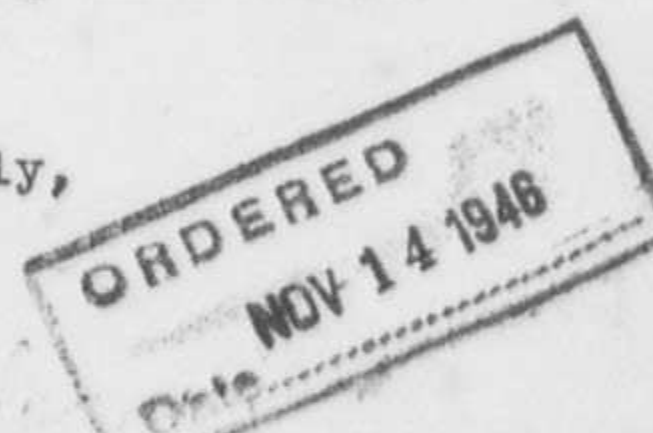
