



The account of the Shingwauk Indian Residential School for drugs purchased locally in the month of December comes to \$23.19, and contains a number of items included in the Department's Drug List. It is true that school principals have been asked to restrict their orders to one per annum recently, but the regulation has not been very closely adhered to, in fact, there was an order supplied to this school in the month of November. The Department is not desirous of entirely abolishing local purchases, but thinks they should be reasonably restricted to supplies required by the doctor and not available from the Drug List.

I beg to report that we have had an outbreak of Scarlet Fever in the Shingwauk Home. The first case occurred about the middle of December and since that time we have had six cases. We are taking care of the patients in the City's isolation hospital and have the Home under quarantine.

At the outset I gave all the children the prophylactic dose of toxoid and have begun their permanent immunization. We hope to soon have the trouble cleaned up.







I have your letter of June 8th regarding dental attention required by pupils of Shingwauk Residential School. I should like to know how many pupils require this service, and whether it could be arranged to hold a one day clinic at the school. We have found this to be much more satisfactory than taking pupils in groups to the office of the dentist. When a clinic is arranged in a residential school as many as from thirty to forty pupils receive attention, whereas usually not more than twenty can be dealt with in the office of the dentist. This may be because members of the staff usually assist the dentist in looking after the pupils treated and those awaiting treatment.


