

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

In reply to my recent request for submission of details of necessary services at our Schools, our Principal at Alert Bay reports as follows:

NEW CONSTRUCTION REQUIRED

A new classroom block is needed as two classes, and some supplies, are housed in the old Girls' School which is intended to be demolished. Approximate cost - \$1,500.00

MAJOR REPAIRS AND ALTERATIONS REQUIRED

Improved Wash Room facilities for the Lower School Boys have been asked for and recommended by the Medical Officer for Indian Affairs. Approximate cost - \$300.00

Waterproofing of the Main School Building has been requested for years. Approximate cost at present prices - \$4,000.00

Changing over Boiler Room to an oil fuel system is necessary in the interest of labour saving and efficiency. Approximate cost - \$500.00

New Floor in the Auditorium is required. Approximate cost - \$250.00

The above major repair items are in the order of importance given by the Principal, who states that he has discussed them with your Agent.

Re: Alert Bay Indian Residential School.

You will recall that some years ago we had some of the exterior walls at the above mentioned school water proofed.

From reports recently received from the Indian Agent it appears that similar action is required at the present time.

In the current year's appropriation we have \$3,000. that could be used for that purpose. It is possible that the amount mentioned may not be sufficient and perhaps the work should be delayed until next year. However, I would appreciate it if you would obtain an opinion from your officials in British Columbia and advise me as soon as possible.

"Panic bolts for fire escape doors are on hand but have not been installed. Fire escape doors are still locked awaiting installation of a buzzer system of alarm to indicate when doors are being opened.

"It is recommended that the above alterations be expedited in the interest of safety should a fire break out."

Please have the panic bolts installed at the earliest possible date and also the buzzer system.

Extract from report of Dr. Tennant dated September 17th, 1947. Original on 315-6-3 re Alert Bay Indian Residential School.

The building has not received repairs which were long overdue on my last visit.

Brick walls have not been water proofed, resulting in flooded play rooms in rainy weather.

The recreation room on the girl's side is already inadequate in capacity for accommodation of nearly one hundred girls. Flooded or wet floors add still another menace to that of overcrowding. Waterproofing of walls should no longer be delayed.

Panic bolts for fire escape doors are on hand but have not been installed. Fire escape doors are still locked awaiting installation of a buzzer system of alarm to indicate when doors are being opened.

It is recommended that the above alterations be expedited in the interest of safety should a fire break out.

A worn out wooden floor in the boys' play room requires replacement and also an unsanitary wash bench in the same room. Plans for these alterations are under way.





You may recollect that on the occasion of my introduction to you by Mr. Forward, the impossibility of securing a contractor to do certain waterproofing at our Alert Bay School was discussed and the question was raised of using the \$2,000.00 provided in this year's Estimates for the reconstruction of the Farmer's Cottage. You suggested that the Principal consult your Agent there and submit bills of materials and estimates of labour required to complete this Cottage.

Subsequently, the Principal was instructed on the above lines and we now have received his reply dated 9th October. In this reply he states that this Cottage has been completed, the work being done mainly by the School Staff and the materials and fixtures purchased chiefly from funds provided by this Administration for minor repairs.

In these circumstances, will you be willing to reimburse us for the materials and fixtures used in this reconstruction and apply the balance of the \$2,000 towards one or more of the items which we have requested for inclusion in your Estimates for 1948-49? Among these items are

- Improvement of Wash Room facilities for the Lower School Boys \$300.00
- Changing over Boiler Room to an oil fuel system \$500.00
- Providing new floor in the Auditorium \$250.00

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
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I understand that the Principal has taken up these matters with your Agent in that locality.


We have your letter of the 20th instant with reference to the farmer's cottage at the Alert Bay Residential School.
