Dear Mr. Daunt:

I am enclosing herewith vouchers in quadruplicate for materials secured from the Valley Lumber Yards in connection with fitting up a Vegetable Room under the barn. I do not often go ahead without securing the Departmental authority, but something had to be done at once in order to save our vegetables. I had thought of getting a combined implement shed and vegetable house, and was making plans for it. This large room in the basement of the new barn was however available. I had it drained at School expense last Winter, but we were not sure that it would keep dry, and so I was somewhat undecided about using it. After investigating however, I found that it had no water in it even during the time of heavy rain, so I went ahead and had it fitted up.

It has given us a large room somewhat "L" shaped, approximately 36' long on each of two sides, and 18' wide. It is reached by a stairway from the main floor of the barn and can be locked securely. I have lengthened the air vents making them to lead from the floor of the barn to the floor of the vegetable room for the cold air, and from the ceiling of the vegetable room high up into the loft of the barn, *for the other*. We have sufficient bins and shelving to take care of all our vegetables.

The account is for materials only. The work was done by our Boat Builder and his helpers, and is a fine job. I am sure the Department will be pleased with the space we have made available in this way. I trust they will overlook my having gone ahead in this instance for the reasons given above, and will authorize payment of the account.



My dear Mr. Hoey: Re: Claim of British Columbia Electric
Ry. Co. against Coqualeetza Residential
School.

As you probably know, for some years the electric power for the Coqualeetza Indian Residential School has been supplied by the British Columbia Electric Ry. Co. When Mr. Scott took over the principalship a few years ago, he called in a representative of the Company and he checked over all the wiring, meters, &c. However, on July 12th, 1935, Mr. L. McPhee, District Representative of the Company, wrote to Mr. Scott, making a claim for \$3,493.93 (later revised to \$2,583.03) for power allegedly used by the School and not paid for because of an alleged defect in the meter supplied by the Company.

Since the date of the claim, our office has been in correspondence with the Company in regard to the matter. Mr. Beaton, my former colleague, in discussing it in Ottawa had his attention drawn by the Solicitor of your Department to the case of General Dairies Limited vs. Maritime Electric Co. Ltd., the decision on which he thought provided us with a good defence against this claim of the B.C. Electric Company. However, when, at the request of the Executive of the Board of Home Missions, we consulted the law firm of Clearihue & Straith in Victoria, B.C., it was pointed out by them that this case had been appealed to the Privy Council and that the latter body had given a decision a few months ago, reversing the decision of the Court of Appeal. This case will be found in the Maritime Electric Company vs. General Dairies Limited 1937 1 D.L.R. 609. As a result of this decision of the Privy Council, the law firm I have mentioned above advise us that, in their opinion, the B.C. Electric Company could collect this bill, and, if it were not paid, the Company could turn off the electric current from the School.

Then we suggested that the Solicitors negotiate for a settlement with the B.C. Electric Company, and they write now to say that the Company will accept \$1,000. in full settlement, to be paid at the rate of \$32.50 a month.

Now, our difficulty is that Mr. Scott has a deficit in the School account at the present moment and our Home Mission appropriation from the funds of the Church is exhausted. We have no available money with which to meet this unexpected - and to my mind - unfair claim. It does seem to us that the Indian Department ought to help us out in this unfortunate situation. It was no fault of Mr. Scott's, nor of our Board, that the Company's meter did not register the full amount of current which it is said was used. All the bills which were presented by the Electric Company were paid promptly. The Coqualeetza School is an enterprise which is carried on jointly by the Government and the United Church, and the per capita grant from the Government is not enough, of course, to make it possible to have any reserve from year to year.

As you know, the United Church is not a business organization and it is purely on charitable and Christian grounds that we are engaged in this work. My submission is that your Department ought to, at least, bear the major part of this account.


Will you be good enough to bring the matter to the attention of Dr. McGill and see if something substantial cannot be done.





Dear Mr Daunt:

I am glad to report that our new system of washing dishes with steam by means of the wire baskets kindly supplied by the Department is a great improvement on the old way. It has been especially valuable during this Measles epidemic. Dr McQuarrie and Dr Henderson both seemed pleased that we were handling the work in this way.

In order to make it thoroughly effective, I really need some more baskets. These supplied, take the large plates and the knives and forks at one time, but the "stalls" are much too high for the saucers. When these are put in, they slip through and lodge one on the top of the other in the bottom of the basket. They cannot be cleaned in that fashion. So we have to put them in the sink which is not very good in itself, and when they are finished, the basket from which they were taken has gone back into the dining room and confusion results.


If we had another 16 baskets, we could put the cups and saucers into them, and thus take care of all the dishes on each table at the one time, and ensure their getting the maximum benefit from the steam and hot water. The tables could be washed down while the baskets were in the washing room, and would be ready for the dishes and to be reset upon their return.

Mr Ferddred, our Engineer, takes charge of the washing and handles the steam, so that there is no danger to the children in any way. The confusion resulting from the inability to handle ALL the dishes belonging to each table, at the one time, does not help to get the girls into the way of the new system. I am anxious that it should be a complete success and would greatly appreciate it if the Department would allow me to secure the additional 16 baskets. These would cost the same as the first ones, \$1.50 each. Even though the sides are lower, being just half the height of the baskets for the plates, there is an extra compartment put in which makes up for the lesser amount of material used. I am setting down a rough sketch of the basket I need. Hoping for a favorable reply from the Department, I am,


