Sir,

Re: McIntosh Indian Residential School.

This will acknowledge your letter of April 15th stating that the Department of Indian Affairs have approved Alternative B as submitted with my report of March 30th making provision for an extension to the power house at some future date.

Referring to paragraph three, the shafting was so designed to operate the pump, motors, etc., at the speeds given in the estimates on page five of the revised report of March 30th. This is a matter however that cannot be definitely decided until the speed of the pump, generator and air compressor as ordered is known. When the speed of these machines is furnished to me I can then determine the size of the pulleys required on the line shaft, the speed of which will be governed largely by the speed of the above machines and the speed of the turbine. I had also made provision for operating the generator, pump, air compressor and carpenter shop separately by operating each pulley individually by a friction clutch.

Paragraph eight of your letter states that definite arrangements have been made with the school authorities to have the work done by day labour by the lay brothers under the supervision of Brother Gauthier. Does this mean that

- (1) The lay brothers will decide upon and purchase or rent all tools and equipment and hire all labour necessary to carry out the work.
- (2) The supervising engineer will not be called upon to certify to vouchers and cost of the work.

The estimate submitted with Alternative A and B were based on competitive bids and I feel sure that tenders could be received from reliable contractors within these figures. In deciding to do this work by day labour I quite appreciate that the work may be done within, or for less than the estimates cost. On the other hand however, I wish to point out that work done by day labour has in many cases exceeded that done by contract, and under the circumstances I can give no guarantee that the estimate will not be exceeded.

I presume from your letter that in addition to the power house the completion of the dam and septic tank will also be done by day labour by the lay brothers.

Before we can complete the details of the power house and order the necessary shafting, piping, etc. it will be necessary for the Department of Indian Affairs to supply this office with a copy of the specifications and blue prints of the machines ordered.
