Dear Sir:

Replying to your 155-0-5 of January 14th, I wish to return herewith the account in favor of F. Parks & Company together with a ~~letter~~ letter received from the firm which explains itself.

Kindly be advised that cheque No. 37372 under date of October 19th in the amount of \$35.00 was paid for tile and work done in the middle of the kitchen floor and in the doorway.

The account herewith submitted has reference to work done where the brick wall, which divides the kitchen from a small storeroom, was taken down. The tearing down of this wall and the removal of a cupboard left a space of 43 feet 1 inch for which tile had to be supplied and set. This accounts for the second account of \$35.00. It is entirely separate from the first.

I can quite understand why there has been a misunderstanding and trust these explanations will make everything clear.

On January the 26 Captain Gerald Barry, of Vancouver, Inspector of Indian Day and Residential schools for the province of B.C. paid a one day visit to Cranbrook and inspected the Kootenay Indian Residential school. The Inspector's impressions regarding progress during the year made by the school in general, due to the constant efforts of a well trained and highly efficient teaching staff, will doubtless be noted in his report. Also improvements in the building, the new Monometal sinks in the kitchen, repairs to tile floors, kitchen stove etc., the moving of a partition between the storeroom and kitchen burlap in the hall, painting and enamelling kitchen and storeroom. A new floor should be laid in the boys' dormitory and more painting throughout the school is urgently needed.

The Inspector stressed the necessity of more frequent Fire Drill as a safeguard against the danger of a general stampede should a fire occur in the school.
