Reverend Sir,

In reply to your letter of April 7th reporting on the cases of the MacDonald children, I may say that it will be in order for these children to receive treatment for syphilis at the rates laid down in Circular 9-1E of March 1st. It is important that treatment be carried to a proper conclusion and Dr. McInnis must be the judge in this respect. If as Dr. McInnis states it is impossible to find a vein in one of the children, he may secure the drug for intra-muscular treatment either from the Provincial Government or from any other source which deals in this class of goods and will give him a reasonable price. Only the standard drug is carried in stock and it would have to be purchased outside in any case. This child should not have to go to hospital.

These instructions may be taken to apply to any pupils of your school who are found to have syphilis in a communicable form or who require treatment of this disease. The account for the taking of the blood tests should be included in Dr. McInnis' regular monthly statement but the accounts for treatment should be placed on separate sheets and forwarded in the usual way.

It may be represented to you that it is not safe to keep these children in school among the other pupils. The Department's attitude in this respect is that pupils who are known to have syphilis and are under treatment are relatively safe to associate with. They may be and probably are less dangerous than some unknown cases among the pupils who have not been examined.

Rev. Sir:

In further reference to your letter of the 7th instant, regarding the examination of the pupils of the Shubenacadie Indian Residential School by Dr. McInnes, and giving the names of the pupils who require attention for tonsils and also those who require glasses.

In reply I have to say that, owing to orders for strict economy and our funds being extremely limited, it will not be possible to carry out all the above work which Dr. McInnes states is required. Only the more urgent cases should be given attention, and I would request that you check over the list of pupils and state the names of those whom it is absolutely necessary should receive attention for tonsils and also those whom it is absolutely necessary should receive glasses.

The Department has recently authorized the supplying of glasses to a number of the pupils, and the account of T. J. Davis, Halifax, who supplied the glasses, at a cost of \$62.00, was received by the Department. This account has not been certified, and I return it herewith in order that you can certify same if you are satisfied that the glasses have been satisfactorily supplied.

Please return this account when you certify same, together with your report regarding the urgent cases requiring attention for tonsils and those requiring glasses.

Reverend Sir,

With further reference to your letter of the 9th instant regarding pupils who require tonsillectomies, I would say that this authorizes the necessary operations. It should be understood that the instructions of the Department are that Dr. O.B. Keddy, of Windsor, should be engaged for the surgical work, and Doctor MacInnis should be anaesthetist. Arrangements should be made for the 26 cases to be done at Shubenacadie school in three or four groups in order that there should not be too great disturbance in the routine. For your information I would say that Doctor Keddy and Doctor MacInnis are expected to submit their accounts to the Department through Inspector Maxner. Accounts should reach Ottawa in three copies. The Department will allow the engagement of a nurse for the operating room if desired. The sum of \$350 has been allocated for the fees of the surgeon, and this sum must include transportation and all other expenses incurred. The Anaesthetist will be allowed \$100 for the work, and the sum of \$50 must cover all other expenditures, such as extra nursing service, etc. The sum of \$500 is expected to cover all expenses in connection with the tonsil operations necessary for the 26 children referred to.

I shall be glad to have your report of action taken in this connection.
