Memorandum for Agent's Guidance.

1. The names of all heads of families (including absentees) entitled to participate in a distribution should be entered on the pay-list each year.

2. The Band Number of a family should on no account be changed.

Should a family become extinct, its number should be dropped and not used again.

3. When a member of a family is to be paid separately, as all adults should be, his or her name must be added at the end of the pay-list, under a new number; and the reason for paying separately should be given in the column for remarks.

4. All increases and decreases that affect the number in a family must be entered in the increase or decrease columns: those entered in the column headed "Other Causes," must be carefully explained in the column for "Remarks."

5. No money should be paid to Merchants or other persons who are not Indians, except by special permission of the Department.

6. No money should be paid to any Indian other than the one entitled, unless upon presentation of a written order, which should be attached to the pay-list.

7. Wherever possible the share of an absentee is to be remitted to him, by express order or post office order, at his expense, and the stub or number of the order is to be attached to or stated in the list. When money is sent by registered letter, a receipt for the letter from the postmaster should be attached to the list.

8. All money columns and the columns showing the number of Indians should be correctly added and balanced. The difference between the number on the list paid at this and the previous payment must equal the difference between the total increases or decreases noted in the increase and decrease columns.

9. The Statutory Declarations should be taken before a Justice of the Peace, or a Commissioner for taking affidavits, according to regulations.

10. The pay-list should be returned to the Department promptly after the distribution with a covering letter and statement. Only under very exceptional circumstances should it be retained longer than one month.

11. No additions are to be made to the pay-list unless title to be paid is made clear. The best attainable evidence of birth is to be got. In organized districts the paymaster should demand production of a copy of certificate of birth.

In the case of women from other districts entering the Band by marriage the paymaster must assure himself that they are not paid elsewhere by communicating with the Agent of the district from which they come. No one but newly born children and women entering the Band by marriage should be added to the list without the sanction of the Department.

Sir,—

Rev Kerbrat, Principal of the Kenora Industrial School has been in to see me today and informs me that there are quantity of fallen trees and unsafe ones on the School property, which it is absolutely necessary to cut down for safety sake and to save the timber.

He wanted to know if it would be in order for him to cut these trees and sell them to the Keewatin Lumber Company, so as to get something for them. The amount received to be used by the School. As this amount would be very small I would recommend his request be granted.

The Principal allows the older pupils to cut cordwood for the School and pays them \$1.00 a cord for the cutting, the boys use this money for various purposes such as purchasing hockey shoes, skates &c, and is a very good training as many of them will have to work in the woods to make a living when they leave school. The wood cut is of course used by the School.

I have told the Principal, he can cut down any dangerous trees and await authority to dispose of same.

The saw &c at the school was purchased by the School authorities and the proceeds from the sale of the few logs could be applied towards paying for this.

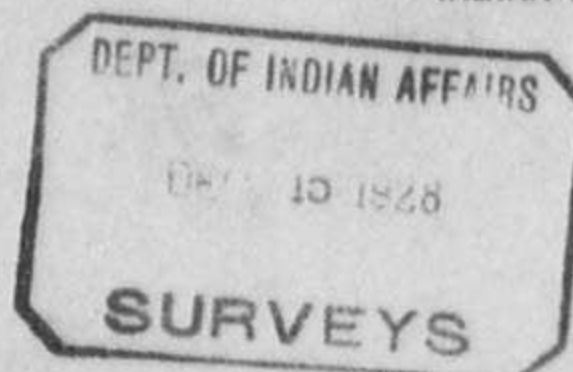

I beg to direct your attention to the correspondence in 1922 and 1923 relating to the transfer to this Department of the 118 acres which was deeded to the church by this Department after surrender from Indian reserve No. 38B, in the Kenora District, and particularly to departmental letter dated Jan. 24th 1923, in which it was indicated that it would be necessary for the school authorities to arrange for a proper survey in order that a correct description could be submitted to the Registrar of Titles for the purpose of retransferring this property to the Department.

Although the Department has subsequently obtained a deed to the property, it does not appear that our records contain a record of the plan of survey. In order that the departmental records be complete, it is required that a copy of this plan of survey be recorded in the Surveys Branch of this Department. I have to ask you, therefore, to be good enough to arrange for the Department to be supplied with a copy of the plan of this survey at as early a date as possible.

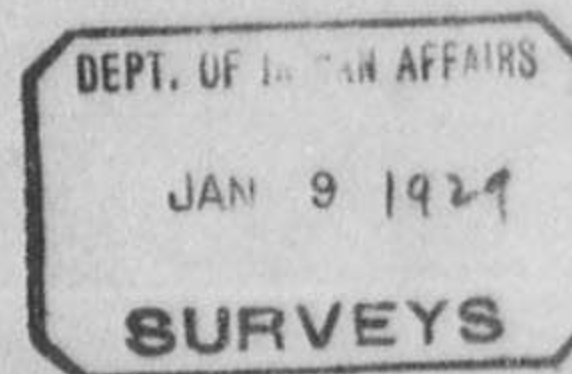



In reply to your letter of the 10th ultimo requesting a blueprint or tracing of the property connected with the Kenora Indian residential school, I beg to say that the property consists of Firstly: a parcel containing 54.6 acres, which consists of the western portion of Mining Location No.18. A blueprint is enclosed showing the parcel which is marked 51 acres, but out of this there is a reservation of 5.34 acres. I am not in possession of a plan to show the location of this parcel reserved.


Secondly: a parcel of land out of Indian reserve No.39B, containing 118.8 acres. The Department is not in possession of a plan of the actual survey of this land and so far as the correspondence shows a survey has not been made, although the church authorities have been requested to supply a plan. A blueprint from the sketch in possession of this Department is enclosed.

Descriptions of the land accompanied your letter of the 1st December 1922 and it would appear that you have this information in your office.

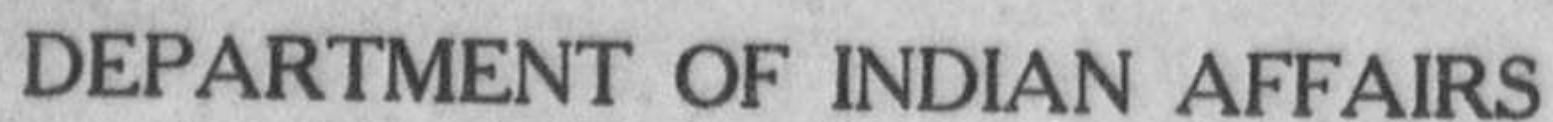

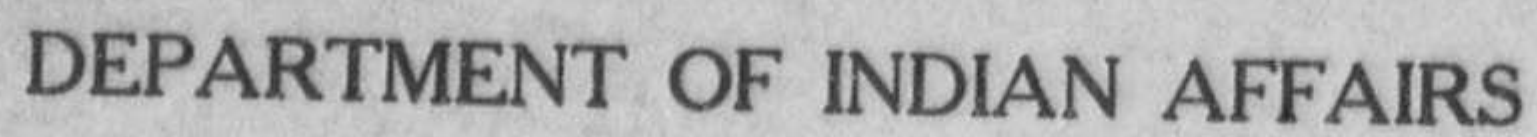
