Ottawa, June 14, 1933.

Reverend Sir:

I have your letter of the 8th instant, enclosing a voucher in favour of the Edmonton Paint and Glass Company, Limited, to the amount of \$50.97, for materials supplied for use in connection with repairs, etc., at the Edmonton Indian Residential School.

In this connection I have to inform you that the total amount provided in our Estimates for the current fiscal year for all purposes at your school is \$300. Our Appropriation was so greatly reduced, that this was the full amount allowed. The Department is paying the voucher which you submitted. This will therefore leave the sum of approximately \$250 available for the balance of the current fiscal year. You may incur expenditure, from time to time, up to that amount. I may say, however, it is considered that quite a number of the items on the accounts which you submitted are a fair charge against the school funds and should be paid, in future, from per capita allowance or other receipts of the school. It is necessary, this year, that you use every endeavour to keep all expenditures within the amount appropriated, as any expense over that amount will have to be met from school receipts.

Dear Sir;

I received today your letter of 14th inst. No. 110-0-5 in reference to the voucher in favor of the Edmonton Paint and Glass Co. I may say that the total account sent me by this firm for repairs was nearly twice the voucher I sent to you, and if there were a few items which might have been charged to my school account it was more than made up ^{by} the accounts for repair which I have paid.

I note your reference to the balance of \$250.00 still remaining to my credit for expenditure outside the per capita grant. As a matter of information:—Does this amount include the grants usually made by the Department for advanced education and transportation? Or are these over and above this \$250.00. If I am confined to this amount I shall have to curtail my advanced education next year.

I presume this amount does not touch medical services.

If possible I would like to have this information before holidays, as a number of things hinge on it.

Rev. Sir:

I have your letter of the 19th instant, with reference to the amount provided in our Estimates for the current fiscal year for the Edmonton Indian Residential School. I regret that our letter of the 14th instant regarding this amount is not quite clear. The sum of \$300 is all that is provided for repairs, replacement to equipment and general expenditure.

Regarding the advanced educational grant, the Department will decide this matter when we have a list from you of the pupils who will be taking courses in higher education during the next academic year.

The total amount that can be allowed your school for transportation expenses this year is \$200. This includes expenses for children going on holidays, for new pupils entering the school and for pupils who are being discharged at the end of the current academic year.
