Further to our conversation in which you requested prices on the two models of kerosene refrigerators currently being produced, namely the W-803A and W-603A, we wish to advise that at the present time they are still under import embargo owing to the shortage of American dollars, and our entire quota for the year was accounted for some time ago.

However, owing to the fact that the refrigerator is to be used for a boys' school there is a good possibility of obtaining one on special permit, and the last prices in effect were as follows:

W-803A List \$485 W-603A List \$360

You would be subject to a discount of 20 per cent from these figures.

Canadian production on the 6-foot model will be underway in October, in case the special permit could not be obtained.

We believe this is the information you require at the present time, in order to submit price to Ottawa, and if we can be of further assistance to you, kindly let us know.

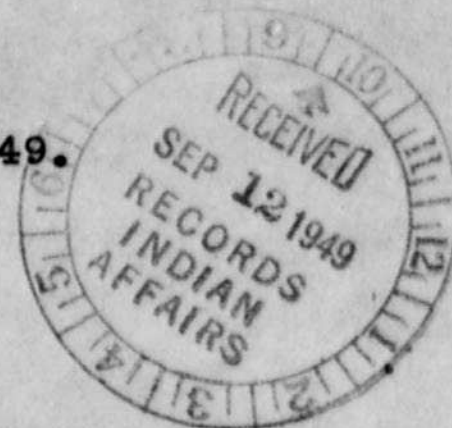

I have a requisition from Field Agent Waite for one Servel Kerosene Refrigerator of 7 cubic feet capacity costing \$450. for the Cross Lake Residential School.

Through Mr. Davis' office, as Mr. Waite was away, we have received a quotation from Dickson Electric Company Limited in Winnipeg quoting on a 6.2 cubic foot capacity at \$360. and 8.1 cubic foot capacity at \$485. less the discount of 20%.

Would you please advise if Mr. Waite or you have any quotations on the refrigerator originally requested at the price stated in order that these may be forwarded to the Purchasing Agent for action. Please advise which machine would best suit your needs.

It is quite possible that we might have considerable difficulty securing the larger machine as this is made in the United States and owing to import embargo, the company cannot guarantee the date of delivery.

In the case of the smaller machine, this is made in Canada and delivery can be made at an early date.

Dear Mr. Phelan,

In reply to yours of September the 16th received yesterday, I must say that I have no quotations for the Servel Kerosene Refrigerator. As Mr Waite is not at Norway House and having seen him only once in August I can not tell you if he had any quotation from Servel.

When Mr Waite was here for paying treaty in June I made the requisition for a Kerosene Refrigerator and I had told him that our electric plan would not be strong enough to carry extra load as we were already using more electricity than we could produce. I told Mr. Waite that we needed a big Kerosene Refrigerator as those they use in restaurants and I doubt that one of 7 cubic feet would meet our needs. It would take at least an 8 cubic feet one or even larger one but not an electric one.

As the navigation season will be closed in two or three weeks I am afraid that it could not be sent by boat but would have to be sent by Railroad Freight Via: Wabowden, Manitoba and we could bring it to the school by tractor in December.

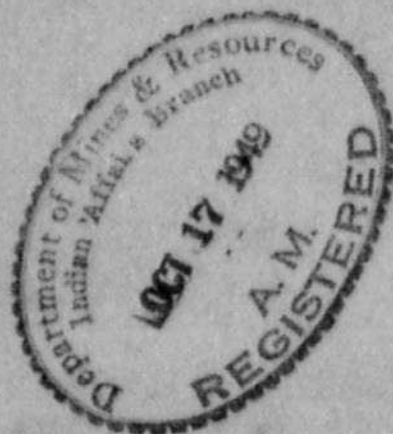

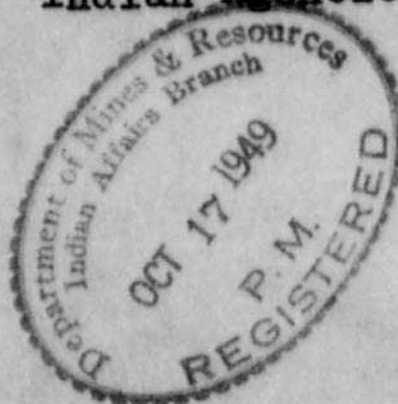

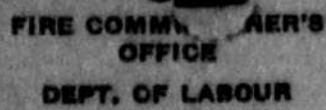
