In reference to your statement of necessity for changes in material, cancellation of previous orders, increased cost of ordering new materials to comply with changed detail, and delay of two or three weeks owing to this, I have to say that your statements are hardly in accordance with the facts, as the only change made was in the support for purline so that rafters would stand clear of sway braces. This necessitated no additional material or changes to same except at the angle which supports the purline. In writing on matters of this kind it would be well to adhere to actual facts as extraneous statements have no bearing on results and take time in ascertaining exact facts.

With reference to alterations from the original plan, I would direct your attention to the last paragraph on page two of "General Conditions" in specifications, which will be strictly adhered to.



Good strong second floor, and wooden bins. Super structure, steel truss, wooden frame, and galvanized iron covering.
