



Sir:-  
I55-0-5, Sept. 27th 1929.  
Re-Light and Power for Kootenay  
Residential School.

I made a trip to Fernie to see Mr. Sanborn, the Manager of the East Kootenay Power and Light Company, Limited. Mr. Sanborn informs me that, with the cost of \$10,000 to connect up the School that he considers they should have at least \$350.00 per month revenue. This would be out of the question as far as the School is concerned.

There is the possibility of having more batteries installed with the present system, and that would give us sufficient power to run a refrigeration plant. This, I consider should be gone into by a competent Engineer, as I am not in a position to figure exactly what adequate power is required.

For your information, I am enclosing Mr. Sanborn's letter to me which explains itself.

Very Reverend Sir:

Pursuant to your conversation with the Superintendent of Indian Education, concerning electric power for the Kootenay Indian Residential School, I have now to inform you that the capital expenditure will be approximately \$10,000, and the Power Company would not consider such expenditure, unless there was a monthly revenue of approximately \$350. As this is out of the question, I regret that the Department can take no action in the matter at the present time.




