

MORANDUM FOR FILE

On July 19th and 30th I visited the Cecilia Jeffrey Indian Residential School. The institution is situated on a peninsula in Shoal Lake. The postoffice address is Indian Bay, Man., and the express and freight, Waugh, in care of the G.W.W.D., Man. Mr. Menzies is a kindly type, but I was not impressed by his ability as an organizer. His wife has no sympathy for the work and I believe is the actual head of the institution. She is not the proper type for institutional life, is matron but cannot handle the staff. The outside man, Mr. Gibson, is a splendid chap with children. He is responsible for the small farm, the carpentering and engineering end of the work. They allow a week-end holiday for the pupils that live close to the school. I discouraged this practice.

The main building needed paint, but material was supplied a year ago and the work was about to be undertaken. The building is badly cut up by alterations and is not suitable for purposes of Indian education. The heating system is inadequate - there are three separate units. The lighting plant is working well. The water intake has had to be rebuilt: church funds are being used.

I promised to send a little athletic equipment and to give favourable consideration to requisitions for material for Art. One of the teachers is a splendid artist and some of the pupils are showing excellent progress.

The school purposes changing the balcony to an infirmary and making alterations in the present sick-room. It can be undertaken by day labour, under the supervision of the staff, provided that one skilled carpenter is engaged and the materials allowed. They will really need more than \$400 which has been promised, I believe. If the Church would furnish the rest of the money, I believe the Department should allow \$600 for this work. I propose to examine the correspondence and write the agent.

I wish to refer to my letter of this file number of March 14, 1923, in which the Department offered a grant of \$400 towards the cost of certain alterations at the Cecilia Jeffrey Indian Residential School - such alterations being for the purpose of providing adequate infirmary facilities. The Superintendent of Indian Education reports that approximately \$800 will be needed to complete the work that appears to be necessary. Please secure a statement from the Rev. Principal, relative to the willingness of the church authorities or the school management to undertake this work on a day labour basis, provided that the Department give a grant of \$600. Mr. Ferrier reports that the work was not in hand, because of the inadequacy of the grant offered by the Department.

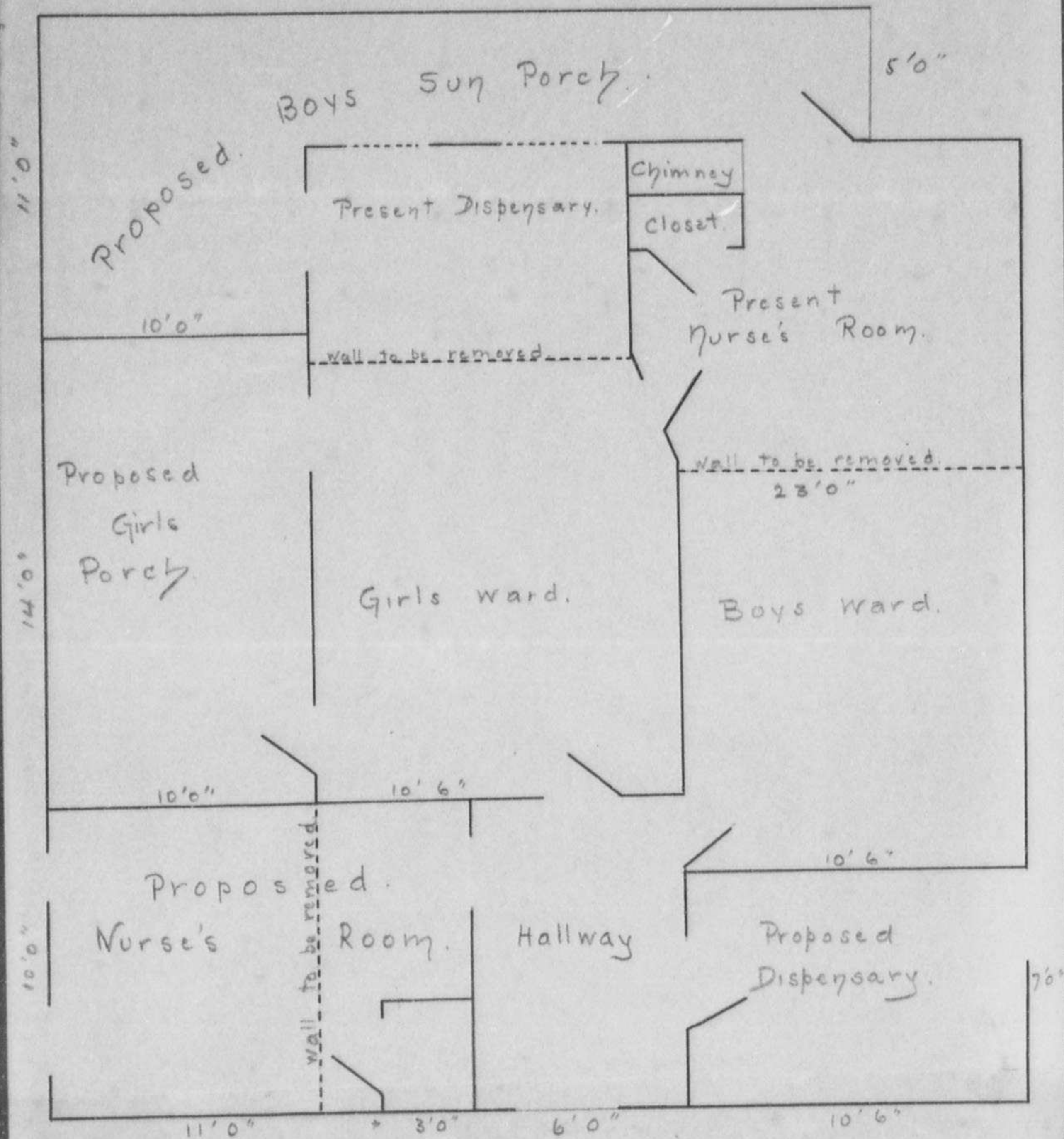

Dear Capt. Edwards:

YOU are aware that certain unfortunate events have interfered seriously with the working out of our plans at the school this season. I may mention the loss of a pair of horses, and the complete holding up of outside work until my return from a brief holiday; also my illness and the operation which laid me aside for six or seven weeks. It has consequently been quite impossible to undertake the proposed alterations of the Hospital, as shown in the enclosed plan. I appreciate the offer coming from the Department of Indian Affairs, but would suggest that, without prejudice to that offer or the changes it contemplates, we undertake now to prepare the building as it is for the approaching winter, by removing the lath and plaster from the outer walls and ceiling applying Sealofelt or similar material between the studding and finishing with Plaster Board, Beaver Board, or like material. This would, in any event be necessary work should it be deemed advisable to add the Sun Porch next season. Be good enough to ascertain whether The Department would approve of this suggestion, and whether they would be willing to provide for the same proportion of cost as in the larger undertaking.




Sir:

look into this without delay.

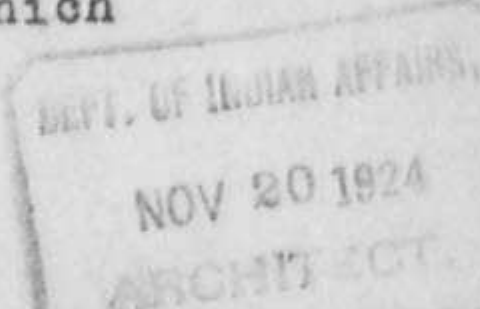
I hope to be in Ottawa in the course of
