Sir;-

I would beg to enclose my report for an inspection visit I made to the Mount Elgin Residential School on the 17th day of December. 1934.

Conditions at the school in so far as the well fare of the pupils are concerned, are in a very efficient state and while the children get eggs supplied them through puddings, they do not receive any for their break-fasts. I also think that they could do with a little more soups made from fresh meats and also have meat a little oftener for their dinner meal, as they were having no meat at all for the meal I attended. The Rev. principal stated to me that they receive meat four meals a week.

The barns at this school need painting to preserve them as they are getting badly rusted. This applies to the exterior wood-work of the whole school which needs painting badly. Mr. Strapp claims that present there is no toilets fit for use in the boys' dormitory and that during the night they must go outside. This he claims is caused by the corrosion of the pipes and a complete overhauling of them would have to be done before they could be used, and these repairs should be done at an early date as possible.

Sir;-

I would beg to enclose accounts in favour of Pennington Bros. Parkhill. Ont. for \$168.00 and being for repairs made to the roof of the Mount Elgin School, which was authorized by your letter 7-0-5 of October 24-34.

To comply with the request in your letter I did obtain tenders from the two parties listed in your letter and which tenders are enclosed and that of Pennington Bros being the lowest was accepted. Believing that the tender of Pennington Bros was a very close estimate of the work needed and not wishing to have a re-action after the work was started I did phone Mr. Pennington to view the work and make sure that he could do a satisfactory job at his price and he sent a man down, who did look over the job and was satisfied to do the complete job for \$168.00 and I instructed him to go ahead with the work. The work was done during the time I was on vacation and was supervised by the Rev. Principal of the school.

After returning from my vacation I did receive the accounts for the work done and was going to forward them to the Department for payment on December 3rd, on which day the Principal of the school phoned me that the roof was again leaking in three places and I held up the accounts and phoned Pennington Bros to this effect and advised them to return and finish the job properly. They did not come and on December 8th I sent them a letter advising them of the leaks. They have this day appeared and claim that they have lost money on the job and it is not their fault that the roof is still leaking and they maintain that they besides other work done have put 550 slates on the roof, which they value at 40¢ a slate and desire an additional \$10.00 to make the repairs still needed.

In repairing a slate roof it is nearly impossible to give a close estimate of the cost of such repairs and this work far exceeded the tender of Pennington Bros, who are to blame and I even gave them a chance to look over the work the second time before I instructed them to go ahead.


The Rev. O. B. Strapp informs me that the work that is at present needed to complete the job properly is a part of that which was contracted for and such being the case the firm should complete their work, no matter how much they are going to lose on their tender and which they now estimate as being between \$8.00 and \$10.00. Mr. Pennington also has informed me that he is taking this matter up with the Department through Mr. Campbell of Kerwood and explaining his case. The account goes forward for whatever action the department desires to take.

As the actual cost for material would not exceed about \$4.00 to buy flashing for the three leaks and as the slates are now all in good shape, I would suggest that this sum be authorized and that Mr. Strapp get one of his men at the school to do the work, for the main part of the Pennington estimate is for time from Parkhill to Muncey and labour.

Sir:

I have your letter of the 31st ultimo, enclosing an account for payment, in favour of Pennington Brothers, to the amount of \$168, covering the cost of repairs made to the slate roof of the Mount Elgin Indian Residential School. In reply I have to say that payment of this account will be made and a cheque will go forward to the above firm in the course of the next few days.

It is noted that a few leaks have developed since the work was done and that you requested the above firm to return and properly complete the work, as it is considered to have been part of the contract. However, as the contractors claim they are not responsible for any further work, the Department, in order to have the roof satisfactorily completed, will approve of you arranging for the purchase of material, the cost of which you state will not exceed \$4.00, in supplying the flashing for the three leaks. The Principal should have one of the staff do the work, without cost to the Department. Please have the necessary material supplied at once and the work carried out as soon as weather conditions permit. You should forward a certified voucher, in triplicate, covering the cost of the material supplied to complete the repairs.

I would advise you that on February 7th, last I received the enclosed account for \$100.00 from Pennington Bros. Parkhill. Ont. asking that the same be sent forward to the Department for payment and it would be paid. On the same date I did write this firm advising them that I had no instruction that a further payment was to be made on their work done to the roof of this school and that I had sent forward vouchers to cover the amount of their contract price of \$168.00 and which the Department had informed me would be paid.

This day I have received another letter from this firm, ~~xx~~ which I enclose for your information and action. This firm accepted a contract for \$168.00 and were given a chance to withdraw their tender as was thoroughly explained by me in my letter of December 31st. 1934. and they did not complete a 100% satisfactory job as I reported at that time and did receive your authority to have the staff at the school, repair the three small leaks after the Pennington firm had refused to do the same unless paid an additional \$10.00.

In my opinion this firm has received their pay in full for the work they contracted to do and the matter is left for what action the department sees fit to take under the circumstances, and would suggest that such work in future be done by the shingle and not by contract.

I would beg to enclose Agent's Report form for the month of March, covering my visit made to the Mount Elgin Residential School on the 14th instant.

The Reverend Principal of this school again brought to my attention the need of additional fire escapes on the south wing of the school proper, for the safety of the pupils sleeping in the girls dormitory. There is one small escape for the south wing, which would not be sufficient to accommodate all pupils in this wing should an outbreak of fire take place, there being over eighty children in the south wing.

Conditions at the Mount Elgin School are in a very satisfactory state, being little sickness, no truancy and the management of the school being under the direction of a young and efficient staff.

Howarth's make of chisels for the Firmer Bevil Edge and Swedish chisels for the socket style - guaranteed lines, especially the Howarth. It is an old English make. The mitre machine is priced without saw. I have added this item at the bottom of Sheet # 1. 28" Back Saw is the one that is mostly used in this machine or we could quote on 26". Also the Stanley Iron Planes quoted on with corrugated bottoms come some higher in price. to the smooth bottoms planes. The smooth bottoms seem to have the preference over the corrugated bottoms. I have also quoted on the best grade Hammer made by Smarts of Brockville. We could also quote on 1 pound Hammer, drop forged heads as low as 50¢ each, others at 75¢ and \$1.00 each. Several items we find have been discontinued. One of these is the #72½ four-fold 2 ft. rule. I have quoted on this in either Lufkin or English make. It is 1 3/8" wide and brass bound. Also the mallets, Lignum Vitae, the kind you described to me over the phone - the price was very high and did not give very much encouragement on locating any. If you decided you would prefer this mallet we would try and locate some at a more reasonable price. Sometimes these discontinued lines are jobbed off at low prices.

Set of Genuine Irwin bits from 1/4" to 1" inclusive. Cost per set \$7.80. This bit is a clean borer in either soft or hard wood. I have tried to explain a number of items in these pages, but if any further information is required I could come out and go over the list and make further explanations on same, or if you would care to come in and go through the Tech Manual Training Department. Here I am at your service and I am sure I can say the same for Mr. White.
